


The 1st Wall Heath Scout Group was formed in 1914 just seven years after Baden Powell had started the Scouting Movement. The Group was formed by Mr R. Worton, the village school's headmaster and local choirmaster and it met weekly

In 1908 Bolton Wanderers granted their captain, David Stokes, a special benefit after he had been with the club seven seasons. He was born at Ketley and initially played for Kingswinford Albion, Wordsley Olympic, Halesowen and Brierley Hill Alliance before signing for Aston Villa. He never actually played for the Villa before transferring to Bolton for whom he appeared 191 times. He played in the 1904 FA Cup Final in which Bolton lost 1-0 to Manchester City.

Charles II visited Wordsley in September 1651 following the defeat of his army at Worcester. He stopped at a house on the corner of Kinver Street and High Street where his supporters laid on a meal for him before he continued his journey on to Wolverhampton.

At an auction held in October 1917 the following local properties were sold: The George & Dragon Inn at Wordsley sold for £700; two cottages in New Street, Wordsley with a yearly rental income of £24/14s were sold for £300; a cottage in Barnett Street, Wordsley which was rented out at £13 a year realised £245; and five cottages in Kingswinford with a total annual rental income of £36 were sold for £400.

Holbeache Dairy Farm once stood where the Maidensbridge housing estate now is. It disappeared in 1958.

In February 1959 an advertisement appeared in some newspapers in Somerset in the 'Situations Wanted' column. It read: "Skilled verger—sexton, do gardening or groundsman. Seek position in South. House essential". In May of the same year another advertisement was put in some Midlands papers in the 'Situations Vacant' section: "Verger, sexton, churchman, active. Five-roomed flat, coal, gas, electricity. £6 weekly and perquisites. Apply with references Rector, Wordsley Rectory.

In the mid 1800s one of the most notable residents of Wall Heath was local architect William Bourne who designed a number of churches and public buildings in and around the Black Country. One monument that he did design was erected in Halesowen and he engaged Henry Beeson of the Victoria Marble & Stone Works to undertake its production. Unfortunately the work was sub-standard and had to be done again. In apologising for the delay Bourne told his client "Beeson is, in some respects the most foolish man I know but I have never found him dishonest."

"Aris's Birmingham Gazette" carried a story in January 1849 about rumours surrounding a possible murder in Kingswinford. The rumours started after a shirt saturated with blood was found by the manservant of a Mr Griffiths near to Himley Farm Pool. Also found was a hat with two holes in it as though a bullet had passed through it. Despite investigations by the local constables, however, no body was ever found and no local men were reported missing.

In September 1848 a total of 48 cases of 'drink and disorderly' appeared in Kingswinford Magistrates Court.

#### MOTHERING SUNDAY: LET'S LOOK AT WHERE IT ALL STARTED

Mothering Sunday has its roots as far back as the 16th century when, on the fourth Sunday of Lent, all church members were expected to go their 'mother' church (usually the parish church cathedral or abbey) to worship rather than attend the service in a 'daughter' church.

These occasions were great family affairs and it became the tradition that domestic servants were given the day off in order to return to their families for the day.

Quite often the sons and daughters returning to their families would bring with them a small present for their mother—hence the modern




tradition of buying a small gift. In days gone by the present would often be wild flowers picked from the hedgerows or a small simnel cake. This is a small rich fruit cake (not dissimilar to a Christmas cake) which is usually decorated with 11 balls of marzipan to denote the 11 'true' disciples of Christ—Judas was excluded for obvious reasons.

There are various suggestions about the origins of the name 'simnel' although generally it is accepted that it derives from the Latin 'similia' meaning a light wheaten flour which was used in its baking. The cakes would be produced by servant girls in the kitchens of their employers and then taken home to their mothers as a present. It has been said that the cakes were named after Lambert Simnel who impersonated Richard, Duke of York, the son of King Edward IV and who tried to seize the throne. However, there are numerous references to simnel cakes in literature that long pre-date the ambitious Mr Simnel and any connection can be dismissed.

A local tale is equally inaccurate. It tells of two sisters, Sim and Nell who were making a cake together and could not decide whether it should be steamed or baked. They even came to blows with brooms as they argued and eventually, it is said, they decided to steam the cake for a while and then bake it as a convenient compromise. There is no evidence, however, that these warring sisters ever existed.

Mothers' Day is celebrated across the world—although on very different dates. In Albania and Bulgaria, for example it is always celebrated on 8th March whilst in Indonesia it is held on 22nd December. In the US—like Australia, Canada, Italy, Turkey and Japan—it is always commemorated on the second Sunday in May.



#### **ORDER IN COURT**

In 1880 the magistrates' court at Brierley Hill was full of miscreants from the Wordsley, Kingswinford and Wall heath areas. These included several licensees from the pubs around and about— Elizabeth Munday of the Albion Inn, Wall Heath was fined £2 and costs for selling beer after hours. Charged with the same offence was Thomas Hand from the Cherry Tree Inn in Barnett Lane,



Wordsley. He, though, pleaded not guilty on the grounds that the bottle of beer to which the charge referred had in fact been sold during licensing hours but that it had not been served until later because Hand had been distracted by carol singers. The deputy stipendiary magistrate sitting on that day obviously took the date of the offence—25th December—into account and found him not guilty.

Alcohol was also the cause of five Kingswinford residents (including 68 year old Elizabeth Farrington) who were each fined 2/6d for being "beastly drunk" at a local wedding and refusing to go home when ordered to by the local police. Those who were on 'relief' but refused work were dealt with severely. Robert Swain was charged with "neglecting to maintain himself" after being offered work in Bromley Lane but then only completing half an hour's labour. His excuse that his work colleagues had threatened him because he was working for less than the normal rate of pay was not, however, believed by Haden Corser, the stipendiary magistrate who promptly sent him to prison for a month with hard labour. Corser told him: "You did not try to work but found it easier to live on other people's money than your own."

Finally, another individual who found himself behind bars was Francis Phillips who stole over 8lbs of meat from Mr Webb, the Kingswinford butcher for whom he worked. The meat was sliced off the joints that Phillips was supposed to deliver to customers. He was sentenced to prison for six weeks.

The Brierley Hill District Schoolboys Under 15 side in the mid 1960s included a wealth of talent—including five youngsters who were to go on to join professional clubs. Martin Bristow and Ian Davies both joined Walsall as did Phil Parkes (who then went on to play for QPR, West Ham and indeed England). Steve James signed for Manchester United and Kingswinford-born Brian Thompson joined Wolves before moving on to Oxford United, Torquay United and Southend United after which he dropped into the ranks of the semi-professional game with the likes of Chelmsford Town, Kettering Town and Rushden Town.



In mid September 1845 Kingswinford Police Court was particularly busy. Amongst the cases heard was that of a man called Rochford who was fined 5 shillings and costs (or in default seven days in prison) for ill-treating and cruelly using two dogs by causing them to haul an overloaded cart. The court heard that the dogs had been yelping loudly and were clearly in great pain. The next case involved James Brazier and James Lamon who were charged with dog fighting at Wombourne. It was said that one of the dogs involved in the fight belonged to Brazier and the other to a man called Pilsbury. He did not want his dog to fight but Lamon held him back. Both Brazier and Lamon were found guilty and fined 20 shillings plus costs.

#### **CLERGY IN THE DOCK**

Normally you think of men of the cloth being good law-abiding citizens—but that has not always been the case (especially, it seems, in Kingswinford)...

Between the 12th and 16th centuries a surprising number of vicars of Kingswinford proved to be somewhat prone to falling foul of the law of the land. Indeed, the only official details about the village's first vicar—William—concerns the County Sheriff taking action to repossess his goods as he was an outlaw. This was in 1186 and 150

years later another vicar of the same name was sued over the rent for a house in the village. He did not appear in court when told to and the Sheriff was sent to arrest him for contempt. In 1357 the vicar of Kingswinford Nicholas Jobynel


was accused of robbery and assault against the Prior of Dudley. On this occasion his co-accused was John de Sutton, the Lord of the Manor. Seventy years later the then vicar (John Bedhill) was accused of even more serious crimes including two rapes. He had returned to his home only to find that it had been stripped bare of all his possessions. It seems that this destroyed all sense of reason with him and

very shortly afterwards he appeared in court accused of raping Joan Tanner and Christine Harewood, stealing silver from the church and entering the park of John Sutton and therein chasing and killing his game.

Whilst he was stripped of his priesthood by an ecclesiastical court, in the criminal court he was found guilty but given a pardon!

Most people travelling along the A591 road from Stourbridge to Kingswinford will be familiar with the smart new building on the left at Glasshouse Bridge. #### What are the differences between a sole trader and a limited company? Sole trader



A sole trader is a self-employed individual trading as a business on their own. The individual and the business are one entity.

#### Limited company

A limited company is a separate legal entity. It operates independently from its owners and the earnings of the Company belong to the company, not to individuals. Which is better – sole trader or limited company?

The best option for you will depend on your circumstances, the size of the business and future plans. Both structures have their pros and cons and speaking to your accountant will be crucial in making an informed decision on sole trader vs limited company.

#### **Sole Trader**

Easy to set up No need to register with Companies House.	Unlimited liability You take on all the risks and liabilities of covering business debts.

Funding opportunities Lenders and investors tend to favour limited companies due to the level of legal protection and tax benefits.	More complex to set up Involves more paperwork and administration, including registering with and paying a fee to Companies House.

#### **Profit extraction**

#### Sole trade

Business profits are taxed as personal income regardless of how much you take out of the business. The amounts you do take out are drawings, and you are not taxed on these.

#### Limited company

Business owners are taxed on income extracted from the company, often in the form of dividends.

#### Tax rates

As mentioned above, there are tax differences between the business structure type. Here we have summarised the 2023/24 tax rates for sole traders and limited companies.

#### Can I change from being a sole trader to a limited company?

Being a sole trader is a good option for many small business owners and self-employed people starting their own venture as it's the easiest business structure to set up. However, there may become a point when you decide it's better to be a limited company and it is simple to make the switch.

#### Is it better to operate as a sole trader or a limited company?

The better option depends on individual circumstances. There's no one size fits all approach, instead you'll need to balance the pros and cons to establish what's right for your business.

In August 1917 the following notice appeared in a number of local newspapers under the heading: Notice of Sale By Auction of an Exceedingly Attractive, Detached Small Family Residence. "Ernest Davies has been favoured with instructions from William Meredith Hughes Esq., the owner, to sell by auction at the Old Bush Hotel, Dudley...that very desirable, soundly-constructed and most conveniently arranged freehold residence known as Beech Tree House standing in its own grounds of 2,223 square yards or thereabouts." Despite the fact that it is described as a "small family residence" the premises actually had six bedrooms, a separate stable block (with loft and harness room) and a series of greenhouses 67 feet long x 15 feet wide. In these were a selection of mature vines that were said to be "the most productive in the Midlands".

In 1838 it was reported that a man known as Poor Old Cookey who was living in Wordsley had reached the age of 112. Apparently he had an accident as a young man which rendered him deaf and dumb. He served an apprenticeship for three years before becoming a labourer with various glass manufacturers. Despite his advanced years it was said that he walked very well and that his hair, although very long, was not yet grey. Indeed, those that did not know him thought that he was nearer 70 years of age than 112.

In early 1858 James and Sarah Caddy suffered one tragedy after another. They had 11 children but in a 10 week period six of them caught "brain fever" and five died as a result—the oldest was 29 and the youngest just 13.



#### **FUN AND GAMES IN THE AREA**

One hundred or so years ago the opportunity to travel long distances to entertainment was enjoyed by only a privileged few. In most cases, therefore, more local events were patronised by the masses. Back in 1882 local residents could choose from a wide variety of garden parties, fetes and flower shows in the area.

The Independent Free Gardeners, a local friendly society, held its annual 'Grand Demonstration and Picnic' at Shutt End Park, Pensnett in June. Members of the society met at various pubs in the area and then marched—headed by brass bands—to the park where a wide range of entertainment was provided.

In Kingswinford the Annual Flower Show was held at Summerhill Court (by permission of its owner Henry Smith) and the funds raised were put to good use supporting various missions across the world.

Wordsley also had a flower show which was held at the end of July at 'Ashfield', the home of Mr E.S. Haines. This was on the site of part of what is now the King George V Park. The entertainment was provided by the 1st Staffordshire Rifle Volunteers Band.

The biggest crowds of any local event, however, were recorded by Stourbridge Cricket Club who attracted over 7000 to their annual sports day. Part of the attraction, however, was probably the fact that the 6d admission included a free pint of beer for all men or a glass of lemonade for the ladies. No sex equality there then!

#### IT'S EASTERTIME—AND TIME TO SHAKE A STICK OR TWO


Easter is, of course, an important Christian celebration but its roots go back well beyond the birth of Christ. In fact the word itself is derived from Eostre. an Anglo-Saxon goddess of the dawn and spring.

It is for this reason that many of the traditional symbols of Easter are connected with birth, fertility and good luck.

Long before chocolate Easter eggs were invented the chicken or duck egg was used as a gift by children to their parents. The children would paint the eggs and give them on the morning of Easter Day.

The Easter Bunny—another symbol of fertility—is associated with the festival largely due to it's ability to reproduce very rapidly. Indeed, in Australia where it is something of a pest because of its high birth

rate, some communities have banned the Easter Bunny in shops, replacing it with the Easter Bilby (right), which is an endangered small marsupial.



Another endangered race

is the traditional Morris Men who entertain in villages both large and small especially around Eastertime. Many of their songs and dances are connected with the annual contest. between Winter and Summer and have been around for hundreds of years. Even Shakespeare refers to the "old art" of Morris dancing. There are different forms of Morris dancing—locally it tends to be 'Cotswold Morris' or 'Border Morris' with six dancers whilst in other parts of the country (the

North West and South Yorkshire, for example) they dance with eight or ten. Also in the North West there is a tradition of all-women Morris Dancing

troupes with the participants wearing clogs rather than boots. All forms of Morris dancing make full use of sticks, swords and other implements and it is thought that the term "to shake a stick" at something has its origins in Morris.



Although England is the traditional home of Morris dancing there are now 150 teams in the US, many more than in the UK. There is also one in Hong Kong and at least two in India! In Finland, Easter traditions include little children dressing up as witches on broomsticks and going from house to house collecting sweets (and it is often said that this was the true source of "trick or treat" at Halloween) whilst in the Czech Republic Ash Wednesday is called Ugly Wednesday!

On 2nd December 2023 the Hospice Jigsaw Library opened its doors to the public for the first time. Located in the seminar room in the Lodge at the Hospice, we have a welcoming warm space where people can come and browse through nearly 1000

puzzles, choose a couple to borrow, enjoy a tea or coffee and chat or pop a few pieces into our community puzzle. It costs £2 to borrow a puzzle and they can be loaned for as long as you like. All

the major brands are represented and we also have over 100 puzzles to borrow in XL format, for puzzlers with sight, motor or dementia issues. The library is currently open Monday and Tuesday 10.00am-3.00pm and Wednesday, Thursday , Saturday 9.30-12 noon and Friday 1.30-4.30 pm. Our opening times are still settling, but they are largely determined by when our army of puzzling volunteers are available to man it.





The origins of the jigsaw library

stem from coming to terms with grief and the combatting of isolation . When I lost my mum in 2019, one of my warmest childhood memories of her was completing jigsaw puzzles. We would spend lots of time together, puzzling alongside one another, sharing a space and each other's company. And so I bought a puzzle and completed my first one in a long time and found it enormously comforting. One puzzle led to another and I would

scour the charity shops weekly looking for the next one. When COVID hit and the shops shut, I set up a little jigsaw exchange on Facebook and started collecting jigsaws and loaning them out from my house to raise funds for my local primary school. A lot of people took to puzzling during the lockdowns and it quickly gained momentum. The number of puzzles in the library grew as did the number of puzzlers wanting to borrow them and I quickly had to sacrifice my dining room to house them all.

In 2022, my dad was diagnosed totally out of the blue, with a terminal brain tumour. I moved to London to care for him at home until he died. Up until that point I hadn't really had any experience or understanding of palliative care. The support both dad and I were given by his local Hospice was incredible. When I returned to Stourbridge I asked my group if we could change the charity we were supporting to Mary Steven's Hospice. The response was a unanimous yes. In addition to raising funds through the library, we started to hold jigsaw festivals in the Education Centre and since we changed to be Hospice supporters we have raised nearly £6000. We are so grateful to the Hospice for the space they have given us now to open a physical jigsaw library, which we hope will enable us to reach an audience beyond Facebook. We hope to be more than a jigsaw store and to be a community outreach hub where people can come and community puzzle, make friends and raise lots of money for the Hospice along the way. While the origins of the jigsaw library and its association with the Hospice come from a sad place, being involved in this project has brought me nothing but joy. I have met some wonderful people and am constantly uplifted by the generosity and resilience of others. We are an inclusive and friendly group and warmly welcome anyone who wants to get involved. If you haven't ever done a puzzle, give it a whirl. It is a great way to keep your mind occupied and slow things down in a very busy and complicated world. You never know you might like it. Happy puzzling.




#### KING GEORGE VI PARK, KINGSWINFORD "FRIENDS OF THE PARK"



Let's Give a toast in Tea to George Edward Wyers, Esquire!

My grandfather Harry was a skilled carpenter. I was not. A 'coffee table' I made in school woodwork, should it have made its way to a London saleroom rather than our coal shed, would have been catalogued, I think, as an interesting example of ethnic art.



When George Edward Wyers became joint proprietor with Margaret, his wife, of Wall Heath's Decormar store in the late 1960s, his ability as an experienced carpenter ensured constructive advice to customers embarking on tricky D.I.Y. projects—of course with anyone like me he'd have said, 'leave it to someone else!'.

The Decormar shop began as a single storey building on a piece of long-neglected land next to a row of old cottages. A Wall Heath veteran recalled an even more ancient dwelling on the site, the front door a step or so down, below the level of the pavement.

For well over twenty years at Decormar, George and Margaret built up a pleasing friendship with all kinds of patrons. Due to an unfortunate concatenation of

circumstances—we had the electricity cut off—my mum and I must have been valued customers for lamp oil, and candles. It was a pleasant experience, drinking a cuppa in the warm glow of the George Wyers Illuminations.

George, a Brierley Hill man born in 1934—the same year as Ontario's Dionne Quintuplets—was always ready for a chuckle. I was there when a lady told him "I'm expecting again." With a straight face, George enquired, "Have they found out what's causing it, yet?". Humorous and helpful—and Mr Wyers loved a nice cup of tea; the cup that cheers you up, and so did George.
