

Much of Sedgley did not have a proper clean—and reliable—water mains supply until 1922, almost 40 years after large parts of Dudley and Wolverhampton had the same facility. The South Staffs Water Co was given permission to supply water to the area by Act of Parliament in 1853 but it was not until 1919 when water from Baggeridge pit was used to supplement supplies pumped in from Lichfield that the company actually completed its obligations.

In the 1920s many of the handmade bricks manufactured in the brickyards of the area were moulded by women. For every 1050 bricks made the moulder was paid 1/7d and their assistant would get 1/1d.

In the late 18th century the cost of food increased substantially following several bad harvests. As a result inhabitants of many of the industrial areas of the Black Country were forced into poverty. One of the industrial areas that did not suffer in this way, however, was Lower Gornal where—although many of the people worked in the nail industry or as colliers—most households still had a vegetable patch where they could grow their own food to supplement what they bought in the shops.

What seems like a very good bargain was advertised in the Liverpool Mercury in May 1884: "Happy home with tender care offered to two little children over three years of age. Terms including board, laundry and education £5 quarterly—Miss Page, Ladies School, Tipton, Staffordshire".

GREAT BALLS OF FIRE!

On Monday, 23rd April 1797 there was a violent thunderstorm that raged for several hours across the Black Country. There were many floods and trees were blown down. The biggest surprise, however, occurred in Sedgley.


During the storm a ball of fire was seen to hurtle out of the sky...and down the chimney of the house belonging to Stephen Cox, a nailer of Sedgley. Cox, his wife and child were sitting by the fireside but were



miraculously left unharmed as the fireball came out of the fireplace and passed through the house and two others adjoining. The fearsome heat melted a lock on one of the doors as well as causing the lead on some of the windows to turn to liquid.

News of the Cox's narrow escape soon spread and over the next few days hundreds of people journeyed to see the damaged houses and to touch the members of the Cox family in the hope that some of their good fortune would be passed on.

Indeed, about three weeks after this event there was another bad storm—the Cox family suddenly found that all their neighbours had come round to their house in order to take refuge. After all they seemed to think, if they had survived one potential disaster then perhaps that was the safest place to be!

IT'S EASTERTIME—AND TIME TO SHAKE A STICK OR TWO

Easter is, of course, an important Christian celebration but its roots go back well beyond the birth of Christ. In fact the word itself is derived from Eostre, an Anglo-Saxon goddess of the dawn and spring.

It is for this reason that many of the traditional symbols of Easter are connected with birth, fertility and good luck.


Long before chocolate Easter eggs were invented the chicken or duck egg was used as a gift by children to their parents. The children would paint the eggs and give them on the morning of Easter Day.

The Easter Bunny—another symbol of fertility—is associated with the festival largely due to it's ability to reproduce very rapidly. Indeed, in Australia where it is something of a pest because of its high birth

rate, some communities have banned the Easter Bunny in shops, replacing it with the Easter Bilby (right), which is an endangered small marsupial.

Another endangered race is the traditional Morris Men who entertain in villages both large and small especially around Eastertime. Many of their songs and dances are connected with the annual contest between Winter and Summer and have been around for hundreds of years. Even Shakespeare refers to the "old art" of Morris dancing. There are different forms of Morris dancing—locally it tends to be 'Cotswold Morris' or 'Border Morris' with six dancers whilst in other parts of the country (the

North West and South Yorkshire, for example) they dance with eight or ten. Also in the North West there is a tradition of all-women Morris Dancing





Although England is the traditional home of Morris dancing there are now 150 teams in the US, many more than in the UK. There is also one in Hong Kong and at least two in India! In Finland, Easter traditions include little children dressing up as witches on broomsticks and going from house to house collecting sweets (and it is often said that this was the true source of "trick or treat" at Halloween) whilst in the Czech Republic Ash Wednesday is called Ugly Wednesday!



FROM SOCCER TO PIGEONS (VIA CANARIES)

Born in Wolverhampton in June 1908 Richard "Dicky" Rhodes joined Wolverhampton Wanderers FC in July 1926 and over the next nine years made 159 League and Cup appearances for the club before transferring to Sheffield United. During this time he was a member of "Buckley's Babes", named after the legendary Wolves manager Major Frank Buckley.

He retired from professional football in 1939 after a short spell with Swansea Town and became a publican back in Wolverhampton running the Old Still.



Having time on his hands he took up a new hobby—canary breeding—and soon he became a leading breeder with a stream of titles to his name. Indeed, he won the "Best Cinnamon Variagated Trophy" for both Scotland and Wales for three consecutive years. In 1973 he won the National title beating no fewer than 1500 competitors at the show which was held at London's Alexandra Palace. By then he had moved to Wednesfield where he had a large aviary in which he kept around 80 canaries, many of which were prize-winning specimens.

His interest in birds, however, was not confined to canaries as he was also a very keen member of the Lower Gornal Homing Society which for many years used the Pear Tree Inn as its headquarters.

For many years Sedgley had its own magistrates court where frequently a Stipendiary (full time professional magistrate) sat. It was not always a very busy court. In 1921 a report in the 'County Herald' newspaper stated: "There were again no cases for hearing at the Sedgley Police Court on Monday. This has occurred at the Stipendiary's Court several times lately, His Worship being engaged (when engaged at all) in hearing summons for non-attendance of children at school. If it were not for these there would be no need for him at all".

The first vicar of All Saints' Church, Sedgley, following the Reformation was Richard Brown who took up his position in 1572. Little is known of his ministry—although the sad facts surrounding his death in 1625 are recorded. As the Parish Register for 30th November of that year tells: "Mr Richard Brown, Vicar of Sedgley and preacher of the Word of God, did the same day come to the Church, read part of the divine service, went into the pulpit and preached, taking his text out of the 7c of Revelation of Saynte John, came down from the pulpit, went to marry the aforesaid persons, and as he was about to read, fell into a soonde and was carried as dead into the Vicaridge, and within a quarter of an houre or thereabouts revived and presently after came into the Church agayne, churched Johan Marshe, married the partners aforesaid and went to the Vicarige gate, backe agayne, and then was carried into the Vicaridge, and within halfe an houre and lesse died".

In 1953 the BBC recorded a half hour section for their radio programme Community Hymn Singing at St James' Church in Lower Gornal. Not surprisingly, for once, the church was full to overflowing.





DUDLEY STEELWORKERS PENSION COMPENSATION

Mr S. from QUARRY BANK worked at ROUND OAK STEELWORKS. In 1994, he was advised by a salesman to transfer his pension to PEARL ASSURANCE (now called PHOENIX LIFE). When he retired, he noticed he was getting less pension than his friends who kept their BRITISH STEEL PENSION. Compensation £91,000.

Mr G. from **DIXONS GREEN** worked at **DMV FABRICATIONS**. In 1994, after he was finished, he was persuaded by an independent financial advisor to transfer his pension to **STANDARD LIFE**. TOMMY BOOTH—FULL CIRCLE

Tommy Booth, the former collier who ran the *Red Lion* in Abbey Road, Gornal Wood for many years owed much to the famous Batham brewing family.

After leaving work in the pits in 1915 he was given the opportunity to become the tenant at the *King William* pub in Netherton, one of the very first public houses acquired by the Batham family.

At the time Daniel Batham did much to encourage Tommy—including giving him a gold sovereign from the first week's takings. Tommy never spent it, however, but had it mounted

on a gold watch chain which he wore any time that he was serving behind the bar.

Although he enjoyed working for Bathams, Tommy was very ambitious and keen to branch out on his own and when the *Red Lion* became available he took the opportunity to purchase it. He expanded the brewery attached to the pub and over the next few years acquired a further four pubs across the area including the *Plough & Harrow* in Kinver. In 1953, shortly before his death the following year, Tommy Booth sold the *Plough & Harrow*...to Bathams! Thus the circle was completed.





Back in 1917 the Dudley Chronicle obviously had many more "Letters To The Editor" than it could print and so it frequently would just print answers rather than the letters themselves. Here is a sample of some of the answers given. We can only speculate about the letters themselves!

Joan L—"Regret cannot avail of your offer at present"

Y Knot—"Person you mention has no more to do with it than a pig has to do with a side pocket"

New beaks—"How impolite. The Council can recommend but the selection and appointment rests with the Lord Chancellor. As for whether — would make a good magistrate as "he's always easily got at" we can't say".




In 1877 at a meeting at the Five Ways Inn, Lower Gornal the "Sedgley & District Rifle Association" was formed. The members heard that a shooting range was to be built on land donated by local company Gibbons. The meeting agreed that all 21 members who had signed up should pay a 10/6d entrance fee plus a 7/6d annual subscription.



In April 1753 James Williams from Sedgley was executed at Warwick Prison. He—along with his brother Thomas and a man called Thomas Davis—had been found guilty of robbing a Mr Matthews of five guineas, a nine shilling piece and a watch. Williams admitted the robbery saying that his other brother Joseph had been unjustly executed at Stafford for the same crime.



In the 1880s there was a publication—somewhat akin to today's Private Eye—called The Magpie which circulated in and around Dudley and Sedgley.

GORNAL PUB ROOTS

In the third quarter of the 20th century several of the pubs in Lower Gornal—most notably the White Chimneys, Queen's Head and Junction—were owned by the Wordsley Brewery, one of the best known local breweries in the area.

Based in the building that later became the Olympia Cinema in Brierley Hill Road, Wordsley the brewery began in 1858. Edward Oakes was the prime mover and under his control the brewery initially prospered. Indeed by 1885 it was producing no less than 4500 gallons a week—and had a very profitable side-line in mineral waters.

Just five years later, however, Oakes was bankrupt and the brewery and its assets were acquired by new owners. Despite a significant marketing campaign and the introduction of a new range of beers (including Imperial Stout "especially for invalids" and a Light Dinner Ale at just 8d) the brewery never made a significant profit. In 1906 the Wordsley Brewery Co together with its 29 tied pubs-including the three in Gornal—were again up for sale. This time they were acquired by the Hereford & Tredegar Brewery Co but just three years later the brewery and its various pubs were again sold. This time the three Gornal establishments were acquired by Ansells.

Both the Queen's Head and The Junction were closed down but the White Chimneys lasted for a further 70 years until in 1984 it was closed and then later demolished. The decision to close this still popular local was somewhat surprising as it had undergone major refurbishment just two years earlier

and plans had been passed for it to be extended. In addition, the outside had been completely re-rendered and the pub was looking smarter than it had for many a year. Its demise was put down to a need for Ansells to cut back on its estate after a disastrous 9-month long draymen's strike that had almost brought the company to its knees.

Payne of Black Country Radio, press coverage and BBC Midlands Today covered the fundraising event on Sunday.



A MOST TROUBLESOME VICAR

Joseph Eccleshall, the vicar of Sedgley between 1657 and 1662 was responsible for the establishment of the first church in Coseley—albeit a non-conformist chapel.

After the Savoy Conference of 1661 had decreed that the Book of Common Prayer should be used in all churches in the country, over 2000 clergy—including the good Rev. Eccleshall—refused to obey and as a consequence lost their livings. Although Eccleshall was supposed to move out of Sedgley and not preach within 50 miles of his previous church, in fact he only went as far as Coseley where he became the driving force behind the establishment of the Old Meeting House non-conformist chapel. For almost 30 years he worked tirelessly in the Coseley community and when he died in 1692 it was felt appropriate that he should be buried in the area that he had come to love and which undoubtedly loved him. Indeed, so many people crowded into the Old Meeting House chapel for his funeral that a disaster very nearly occurred. With a tremendous 'crack' the floor of the chapel gave way and some of the congregation were pitched into the cellar. Luckily no-one was badly injured and hurried arrangements were made to conclude the service in an adjoining orchard. The problem remained, however, as to who was going to pay for the repairs to the church building. An appeal was launched as a memorial to Eccleshall and the money needed to repair the chapel floor was quickly raised from the local Coseley population. Indeed, much more than was needed for the floor was collected and the surplus was put to providing education for some of the youngsters in the village. For several years afterwards a special anniversary service at the Old Meeting House was held in memory of Joseph Eccleshall and frequently this had to be held in the adjoining orchard, not because of damage to the church but because of the sheer volume of attendees.

TOP GOLFER WITH SEDGLEY ROOTS

One of the country's leading golfers in the 1920s and 30s was Archibald Compston, a Sedgley lad who was a member of the first three British Ryder Cup teams. Archie's father, John, was a Limeburner who lived in Bath Street, Sedgley with his wife Maryanne and four children.

In the 1901 census the eldest son—also called John—was described as being a "golf green keeper" and it would seem that it was through him that Archie, the youngest member of the family, was introduced to the sport. Certainly Archie became a regular at Penn Golf Club before finding



employment at Kidderminster Golf Club (where he was sacked for "idleness" in 1909). Despite this setback he went on to become a leading professional and was chosen to represent his country in the first three Ryder Cup challenges against the United States. He later became the resident professional at Coombe Hill Golf Club in Kingston Upon Thames where he taught King Edward VIII to play the game. Archie was best known in golfing circles for his amazing 18 and 17 victory over the great Walter Hagan in a 72 hole challenge match in 1928. The stakes were £500, a very significant amount in those days and it was said that there were also a number of side-bets running which amounted to several hundred pounds more. Amongst his other little quirks Archie Compston also had the unusual habit of employing three caddies when he played. One caddy would carry his clubs, another would take charge of his jacket and jumper and the third would hold his cigarettes and pipe!

On 4th November 1835 it was announced that Queen Adelaide, the wife of King William IV, had become one of the subscribers to an edition of the New Testament published by Rev Girdlestone, the vicar of Sedgley. The edition—complete with Notes and Commentary—was published to raise funds to pay off the debt of the church rate.



One of the rhymes that youngsters in the area used to chant was:

"Rawhead and Bloody Bones Steals naughty children from their homes Takes them to his dirty den, And they are never seen again"

Rawhead was characterised as an evil old man who lived at the bottom of pit shafts and feasted on human flesh—the fresher the better! Bloody Bones was his accomplice who chewed bones!



One of the most amazing stories regularly quoted in Sedgley is the tale of 'Petticoat Phoebe'. It is said that she carried two mugs of beer to the pithead where her husband and son were working. She accidently fell down the shaft, however, and it was feared that she would be killed. Fortunately, though, her petticoat billowed out around her and acted as a parachute allowing her to descend slowly down without injury. Indeed, such was the cushioning effect of the petticoat that not only did she suffer just minor bruises but also she didn't spill the beer that she still held in her hands!

MOTHERING SUNDAY: LET'S LOOK AT WHERE IT ALL STARTED

Mothering Sunday has its roots as far back as the 16th century when, on the fourth Sunday of Lent, all church members were expected to go their 'mother' church (usually the parish church cathedral or abbey) to worship rather than attend the service in a 'daughter' church.

These occasions were great family affairs and it became the tradition that domestic servants were given the day off in order to return to their families for the day.

Quite often the sons and daughters returning to their families would bring with them a small present for their mother—hence the modern



tradition of buying a small gift. In days gone by the present would often be wild flowers picked from the hedgerows or a small simnel cake. This is a small rich fruit cake (not dissimilar to a Christmas cake) which is usually decorated with 11 balls of marzipan to denote the 11 'true' disciples of Christ—Judas was excluded for obvious reasons.

There are various suggestions about the origins of the name 'simnel' although generally it is accepted that it derives from the Latin 'similia' meaning a light wheaten flour which was used in its baking. The cakes would be produced by servant girls in the kitchens of their employers and then taken home to their mothers as a present. It has been said that the cakes were named after Lambert Simnel who impersonated Richard, Duke of York, the son of King Edward IV and who tried to seize the throne. However, there are numerous references to simnel cakes in literature that long pre-date the ambitious Mr Simnel and any connection can be dismissed.

A local tale is equally inaccurate. It tells of two sisters, Sim and Nell who were making a cake together and could not decide whether it should be steamed or baked. They even came to blows with brooms as they argued and eventually, it is said, they decided to steam the cake for a while and then bake it as a convenient compromise. There is no evidence, however, that these warring sisters ever existed.

Mothers' Day is celebrated across the world—although on very different dates. In Albania and Bulgaria, for example it is always celebrated on 8th March whilst in Indonesia it is held on 22nd December. In the US—like Australia, Canada, Italy, Turkey and Japan—it is always commemorated on the second Sunday in May.

Let's Give a toast in Tea to George Edward Wyers, Esquire!

My grandfather Harry was a skilled carpenter. I was not. A 'coffee table' I made in school woodwork, should it have made its way to a London saleroom rather than our coal shed, would have been catalogued, I think, as an interesting example of ethnic art.



When George Edward Wyers became joint proprietor with Margaret, his wife, of Wall Heath's Decormar store in the late 1960s, his ability as an experienced carpenter ensured constructive advice to customers embarking on tricky D.I.Y. projects—of course with anyone like me he'd have said, 'leave it to someone else!'.

The Decormar shop began as a single storey building on a piece of long-neglected land next to a row of old cottages. A Wall Heath veteran recalled an even more ancient dwelling on the site, the front door a step or so down, below the level of the pavement.

For well over twenty years at Decormar, George and Margaret built up a pleasing friendship with all kinds of patrons. Due to an unfortunate concatenation of

circumstances—we had the electricity cut off—my mum and I must have been valued customers for lamp oil, and candles. It was a pleasant experience, drinking a cuppa in the warm glow of the George Wyers Illuminations.

George, a Brierley Hill man born in 1934—the same year as Ontario's Dionne Quintuplets—was always ready for a chuckle. I was there when a lady told him "I'm expecting again." With a straight face, George enquired, "Have they found out what's causing it, yet?". Humorous and helpful—and Mr Wyers loved a nice cup of tea; the cup that cheers you up, and so did George.

A GARDENER'S WORK IS NEVER DONE!

With phenomenal rain and saturated gardens in late February, you may be feeling a little disheartened to begin working towards the beautiful colours we expect in the summer months, but the time has arrived to start sowing seeds, take cuttings and generally work through the plans that have been made for 2024—whether you choose to have a garden full or of organic vegetables, borders full of summer flowers or a mixture of both, now is definitely the time to get gardening and grow!

Daffodils will by now be coming to the end of their lifespan so tie them back and leave them die back, mulch the ground around shrubs and divide perennials. Now is also the time to give a spring trim to roses, hedging plants and Dogwood to ensure new growth. Be sure though to look for areas of the garden that need a change—lift old woody bushes and consider adding a few new small shrubs that can grow and add contrast over the coming couple of years.

Now is also the time to sow hardy annuals and perennials under glass, ideally in a heated greenhouse or on a windowsill and take cuttings of stock plants that have been over wintered like Fuchsias and Geraniums—Begonia and Dahlia tubers should be planted too but try not to over water them. Hanging baskets and patio container trailing plants like Nepeta, Helichrysum and Verbenas always add value, colour and contrast to any display.



If you find space a little challenging then why not consider ordering plug plants online. Otherwise pop down to Prestwood Cave Nursery where they will have a selection of basket starter plants. These are often an economical way of increasing the amount of plants you have without the downside of seeds not germinating, young seedlings dampening off or late frosts affecting growth rates. Furthermore, buying in fully grown plants during April and May can work out expensive per plant with a limited choice of colours and varieties available due to everyone wanting plants at the same time.

Many nurseries are now taking orders for hanging baskets which will be ready to collect from the end of May, once frosts have hopefully left us or why not attend a

hanging basket workshop at Prestwood Cave Nursery and make your own basket to impress family and friends. Booking is essential for this to avoid disappointment—times are available through May in the afternoon or early evening.

Finally, don't forget the birds and keep ponds from icing over as frosts can still occur right up to mid May. Watch out for seedlings, plugs and tender plants who are also prone to frosts even if grown in a greenhouse.




