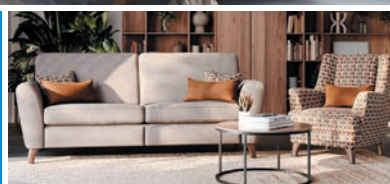

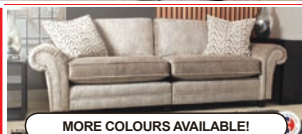

Broken Or Damaged Windows? Faulty Locks, Handles, Hinges?



it's a fact!

- ★ There was a near riot in Tipton during the General Election campaign of November 1868. Supporters of candidate Dr Kenealy toured the streets throwing stones at passersby and the police. Indeed one special constable was attacked and had to take shelter in a nearby house. His assailants, however, dragged him out and beat him with pick-axe handles leaving him for dead. Pubs were attacked and eventually thirty policemen were sent out to quell the disturbance and a company of the 4th Rifles were put on standby in Wolverhampton in case they were needed.
- ★ An incident on 27th April 1779 at Sedgley Courthouse caused outrage throughout the village. As the entry in the court records shows: "*Wm Southwick, gentleman, during the Sitting of this court with great force and violence with a wooden club or stick of the value of one penny which he then and there held in his hands did assault and strike Wm Bennett, Deputy Beadle of this Manor, in the mouth and thereby knocked out two of his teeth and so drew blood from the same Wm Bennett.*" Southwick was fined 39s/11d.
- ★ In March 1863 it was reported that 800 children from the Independent and Wesleyan Schools in Gornal walked in procession through the village together with "*an excellent drum and fife band and banners with suitable inscriptions*". The occasion was the celebration of the marriage of the Prince of Wales to Princess Alexandra of Denmark. After the procession the children were each presented with a medal before returning to their schools where buns and oranges were awaiting them.

A PARK FOR THE PEOPLE

Back in May 1893 some 860 ratepayers from Tipton sent a petition to the Tipton Local Board of Health requesting the development of a new park in the township...but nothing happened until 1897 when it was further suggested that some form of commemoration of the forthcoming Diamond Jubilee of Queen Victoria should be planned. This coincided with an anonymous donation by a local resident of £500 towards the cause—as long as it was a public park and the rest of the money was raised by public subscription.

A site of 35 acres off Park Lane East was then acquired at a cost of £1,500 and plans were drawn up. However, a substantial amount of preliminary work had to be undertaken as coal mining had taken place there and there were mine shafts to be capped and a large spoil heap to be removed. Perhaps the most impressive aspect of the park, however, was the various donations provided by local residents—an ornate drinking fountain costing £100, a children's gymnasium and shelter, several park benches plus a peacock and two swans were all given. Work on the park continued apace until an opening date of 29th July 1901 was set. Unfortunately not all was quite ready on the chosen day as the lake had not been completely filled. This, though, did little to disrupt the celebrations.

The opening commenced with a grand procession from the council offices in Owen Street to the park. At the head was the Earl of Dartmouth accompanied by mounted police, the Princes End Prize and Dudley Port bands, the Tipton Rifle Volunteers, the Boys' Brigade, local councillors and the mayors of the adjoining boroughs. They were met at the park gates by hundreds of on-lookers who watched as the Earl opened the gates with a ceremonial silver key. The crowds flooded in and enjoyed the new park and all its glories.

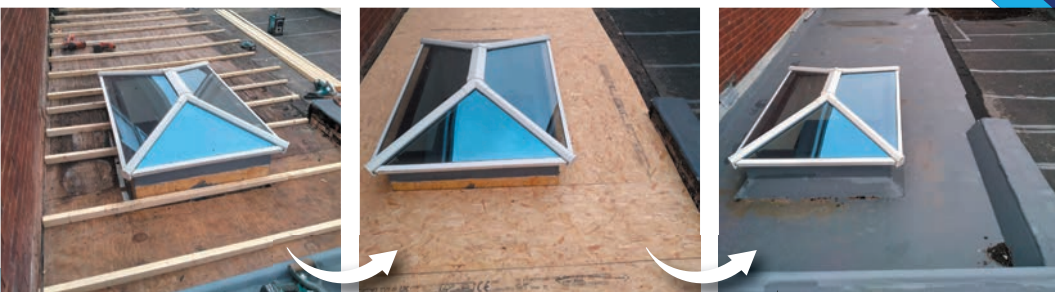

it's a fact!

- ★ In 1351 John de Vherleton, John de Hynkeleye, William Moyle, Adam Flemmyng and Edmund de Penne (all of Sedgley) together with Walter, Vicar of the Church of Seggesleye, were charged with illegally seizing land including 1080 acres of woodland from Roger le Aylesbury and Roger Hillary. The defendants failed to appear in court but were found guilty in their absence. They were required to forfeit half their own lands and pay 1000 marks.
- ★ In 1922 John Harper of Hill Street, Upper Gornal was summonsed by Mr H Bashford, the Attendance Officer, for not sending his daughter to school. His wife appeared in court and said that the child had a bad heart which hurt her eyes (!) Dr Ballenden gave evidence that he believed that the child was perfectly fit to go to school but Mrs Harper disagreed and that she would only send her daughter to school once she was convinced that she was fit. The Stipendiary magistrate, N.C.A. Neville, made an order that the child should be sent to Lichfield Industrial School until she was 14. At this the mother threatened the Attendance Officer warning him that "someone will pay". Bashford then said "I'm not afraid of you.". "You should be" retorted the Mother who was then fined 14s for not bringing the child to court.
- ★ In 1919 Coseley Education Committee decided to accept a tender from John Marston Ltd for the supply of a 'Sunbeam' bicycle for use by the school nurse. The cost was £22/12s (with a lamp and bell extra). The Committee also accepted an offer from Wolverhampton Eye Infirmary to purchase tickets entitling patients to one month's treatment at the Infirmary either as an in-patient or out-patient. The cost was one guinea for three tickets.

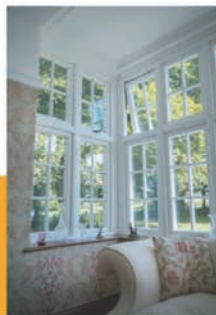

HOW OTHERS SEE US

It is sometimes interesting to see just how others see us and where we live.

Sometimes, however, the views are not always what we might want to hear...

In 1934 J.B. Priestley wrote his celebrated travelogue *"English Journey"* which included a short visit to Gornal: *"I remember arriving at the very end of the earth where the land appeared to have been uprooted by a great pig and where there were cottages so small and odd that they must have been built for gnomes, and the end of the earth was called Gornal and there the women, returning home from the brickworks wore caps and shawls...and looked as outlandish as the place they lived in."*



Sedgley has not fared much better—indeed none other than Queen Victoria (seen left) who wrote in 1893 that she was very distressed about the news of the “deplorable conditions of the homes of the Sedgley poor” following reports of a young girl dying in poverty.

In 1868 Dr Ballenden, the Medical Officer of Health for Dudley, wrote in a report about the area: “Thirty years amongst the nailers of Sedgley convinces me that they are the most immoral people in England...the women have more manly qualities than the men and in free fights the wife is generally the victor”.

Coseley doesn't escape either. “Coseley is an area that defies description. It is dirty and the people are dissolute and barbaric. It is not a place to visit after dark”. This was by Charles Dickens.

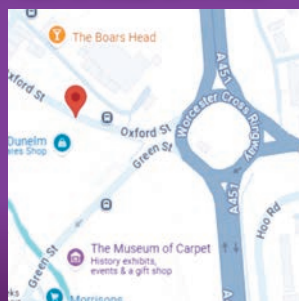

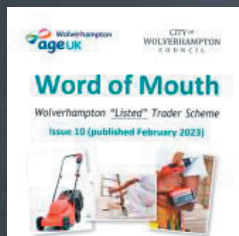

INDEPENDENCE MATTERS

DRUNKEN NIGHT OUT ENDS IN TRAGEDY

What started as an evening out with friends ended with the tragic and brutal death of a pregnant woman at the Jolly Crispin in Upper Gornal...

On 23rd September 1844, 52 year old Joseph Penn and his partner Prudence Hughes met up with friends at the Hare & Hounds in Dudley before starting to return towards Sedgley where they lived. The friends were in front of Penn and Hughes as they walked down the road but Prudence caught up with them and showed that her mouth was bleeding as Penn had just hit her. The two friends then went their own way and Hughes started to walk towards the Green Dragon pub at the top of Jews Lane in Upper Gornal, leaving Penn (who was wearing a white smock-frock) following her some distance behind.

At about 2.00am the following morning a man called Carter living in Gornal heard a woman scream and when he looked out of his window he saw a man in a white smock-frock hitting a woman. He called out but the couple started walking down the road away from his house. Later that morning two policemen (Isaac Tomkinson and Francis Eager) were on patrol nearby when they came across Penn and Hughes. Prudence Hughes was laying on the road and her boyfriend was standing over her.

The policemen asked Penn what was happening and he said that she was just drunk. PC Tomkinson, however, noticed some blood on the road and Penn quickly changed his story and said that she was having a miscarriage. PC Tomkinson immediately went off to find a doctor whilst PC Eager, with the help of Penn and a passerby carried Prudence Hughes to the nearby Jolly Crispin pub. As soon as the surgeon arrived Penn was escorted to Coseley Police Station for questioning. Here he said that all he had done was try to persuade Hughes to return home to her three children and the only violence he had shown her was to push her. It was clear that Prudence Hughes was in a bad way and at about 9.00am on 24th September she died at the Jolly Crispin. An inquest was held and evidence as to the cause of death was given by Dr Ballenden who had attended her at the pub. He said that she had suffered two haemorrhages following ruptures of two arteries, one of which was undoubtedly caused by a blow.

Penn stood trial at Stafford Quarter Sessions and was found guilty of manslaughter. The Judge—Justice Colman—announced that the sentence was that Joseph Penn should be transported to Australia for a period of ten years. On 28th March 1845 Penn with 219 other convicts was taken aboard the SS Theresa which sailed for Van Diemen's Land (Tasmania) arriving there on 3rd July 1845. It seems, however, that Penn died just a few months later. It is said that, at times, the ghost of Prudence Hughes still haunts the Jolly Crispin and that her voice can be heard calling for forgiveness from her children.

SAVINGS FOR A RAINY DAY

Prior to the introduction of the Welfare State in 1948 many people used Friendly Societies in order to save for an income in old age or as insurance against illness or an inability to work. So successful were these societies that by the end of the 1800s there were some 27,000 Friendly Societies throughout the country.

Most of the societies were based in pubs—where men would go to deposit their savings—and were given memorable names. For some reason around the Black Country the names of flowers for the societies was very popular. ‘**The Fuchsia Friendly Society**’ was based at the Red Lion in Gornal Wood whilst the ‘**Geranium**’ Society had its headquarters at the Red Cow at the Graveyard (otherwise known as Grosvenor Road).

‘**The Thistle Friendly Society**’ met at the Wagon & Horses in Lower Gornal and at the Cross Inn in Kingswinford. Other popular themes included mining (‘**The Miners’ Hope**’ at the George & Dragon in Upper Gornal, ‘**Miners’ Refuge**’ at the White Chimneys in Gornal Wood and the ‘**Miners’ Pride**’ based at the Limerick Inn in Lower Gornal).

There were some societies whose name might be associated with the good feeling that the association provided. Typical examples included ‘**Heart’s Content**’ at the Old House At Home in Coseley and ‘**The Band of Hope**’ at the Old Mill in Ruiton.

DID YOU KNOW?

In 1841 in Sedgley most men (1,905) were employed in mining followed by (1,863) in manufacturing. As far as women were concerned the most popular employment was domestic service (419).

In Coseley during the 1940s 'David Whitebeard' was a well-known character. Living rough in a makeshift tent pitched near the mouth of the Coseley canal tunnel, David was a kindly figure—apart from when he saw stray dogs which he would pursue with a stick!

In 1971 Sedgley and Gornal (like the rest of the borough of Dudley) was one of the last areas in the country to be allocated postcodes. The first postcodes were allocated to the Norwich area in 1962.

During the Second World War the miners at Baggeridge Colliery were given a coal allowance of one ton a month. In many cases they would sell it to friends or relations (the average cost was 2/6d. However, this was firmly against the regulations and on occasion miners appeared in court accused of selling coal. In most cases a hefty fine (up to 15/-) was imposed.

In 1922 Sedgley Urban District Council had plans to acquire eight acres of land close to the Green Dragon pub in order to build a cemetery serving Upper Gornal. The Council appointed a committee to negotiate with the owners of the land. Unfortunately an agreement could not be reached and the cemetery was never built.

The old Manor of Sedgley covered about 12 square miles and included nine villages—Ettingshall, Sedgley, Gospel End, Cotwall End, Upper Gornal, Lower Gornal, Woodsetton, Coseley and Brierley.

A CASE OF MISTAKEN IDENTITY!

In 1899 Sedgley Police Court heard the case of the “disappearing son” when Isaiah Jones was summonsed to appear before the magistrates.

Isaiah, his wife Mary and three children lived in Lower Gornal and he appeared in court because his son Joshua had not been attending school. When asked why his son had not been at school Isaiah stated that he did not have a son!

He told the magistrates that he had three children but they were all girls—Joan, Margaret and Alice. However, he did admit that his brother called Isaac did indeed have a son called Joshua—and that it so happened that they lived next door to each other.

The newspaper report of the time described Mr Jones’ demeanour as “happy” as he left court after being found not guilty after what was clearly an administrative error. That cheerfulness almost certainly quickly evaporated when he was served with a new summons on the steps of the court because neither Margaret nor Alice had been going to school!

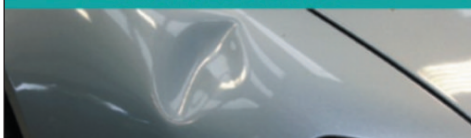

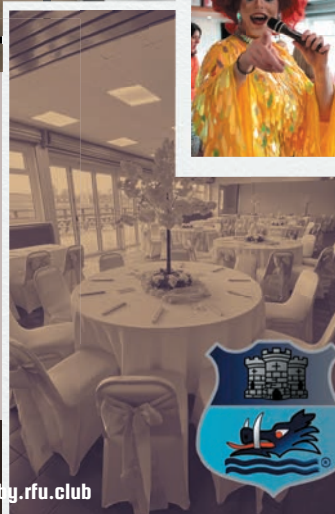
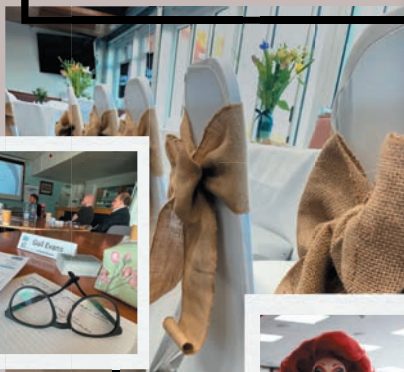

- ★ In August 1928 Frederick Higginbottom and his wife, May, were found guilty of keeping a betting house and acting as bookmakers without a licence. Following a tip-off the police kept watch on their house in Horsley Heath over four days during which they observed 39 men, 52 women, 28 girls and seven boys all entering the premises. The decision was taken to raid the house where betting slips and a large amount of cash was found. The couple were fined £48/10s.
- ★ At Stafford Assizes in December 1857 Sarah Cherrington was charged with the murder of a Sedgley woman called Susannah Cartwright. Cartwright was pregnant but could not afford to pay for a doctor to attend her. When she was about to give birth she engaged Cherrington to assist but it later appeared that she did not know what to do when complications set in. As a result Cartwright and her child died. Although the jury found Cherrington guilty they recommended that the Judge show her mercy. Indeed this is exactly what he did, allowing her to go free without penalty, saying that she had been motivated by “the kindest feelings”.
- ★ In 1877 magistrate—Isaac Spooner—fined Joseph Blackham, an 11 year old, 20/- (or in default three months imprisonment with hard labour) for assaulting Mary Ann Hickman at Ruiton. Apparently Blackham had shot at her with a catapult, hitting her in the eye. The magistrate condemned such bad behaviour, saying that it was totally unacceptable. Indeed, he said, he had heard of two cases where people had lost the sight in an eye through such antics—hence the substantial fine or alternative period in prison.

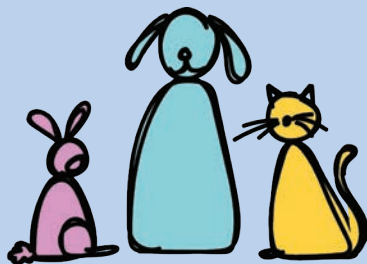

RECORD BREAKING ANCHOR FOR TIPTON FIRM

In 1867 H.P. Parkes of Tipton manufactured what was then the largest anchor ever made. It was for the giant 'SS Great Eastern' ship designed by Isambard Kingdom Brunel.

Originally built in 1858 as a passenger liner for the trans-atlantic route (although it was rumoured that it could carry 4,000 passengers non-stop to Australia as well), the 'Great Eastern' suffered several disasters including a massive explosion that saw one of the funnels catapulted into the air. The cost of repairs for this and an extended stay in New York whilst repairs were carried out after it hit a rock in the harbour there actually bankrupted the company that owned the ship and it was sold at auction.

Despite the fact that its scrap value alone was put at around £100,000 the ship sold for just £25,000. The new owner then chartered it to the Telegraph Construction Company for use in laying cables across the Atlantic. The great weight of the cables that the ship had to carry for this enterprise meant that a new, much larger and heavier anchor was needed and so Parkes were asked to make one weighing eight tons, a world record in those days. Following its service laying cables the 'Great Eastern' was used in various ways including as a mobile advertisement for Lewis's department store in Liverpool.



The 'Great Eastern' was a marvel of its time but suffered problems throughout its lifetime.

it's a fact!

- ★ There was great controversy in Upper Gornal in March 1877 when the vicar of St. Peter's announced that he would not give permission for his parishioners to marry outside his parish unless they obtained his consent and pay him the necessary fees. Not surprisingly this upset many of those who wanted to get married in neighbouring parishes and questions were asked whether the vicar's ruling was indeed legal. Before an answer could be found, however, the vicar moved on to a new parish and calm was once again restored.
- ★ At the end of October 1900 a concert was given by scholars past and present of Coseley's Christ Church Schools. The first half included a series of songs performed by current pupils of the schools whilst the second half featured a work called Britannia, Queen of the Ocean involving some 30 performers. The concert was very well received by a capacity audience.
- ★ In 1909 it was announced that Frank Webb, a butcher of Louise Street, Gornal Wood, had been found dead at home with his throat cut. It seemed that he had been due to attend court to answer charges of persistent cruelty to his wife and that on the eve of his appearance at Sedgley Police Court he had taken his own life.
- ★ Originally the current Dormston Trading Estate on Burton Road was the site of Cartwright's Brickworks which employed many women from the Upper Gornal area. The rates of pay were known to be amongst the highest in the industry but the standards expected were very high—anyone found producing more than 5 sub-standard bricks in 1,050 was invariably sacked.

DRINKS: MAKE MINE A GIN—AGAIN!

A review by Trevor Langley

And now for the second of our independent reviews on drinks around the world by Trevor Langley. Trevor is an independent reviewer of all things drink—he sources his own companies and has absolutely no connection at all to the brands which he chooses to write about. We thought this was a little different to our normal articles so now over to Trevor as he reviews the multi award-winning company Ginagain.



For this quest I searched several gin producing companies, and, indeed, there are a good number of excellent producers of very fine gins. Multi award-winning Ginagain Spirits received recognition from the outset and has grown to have many ‘devotees’ of their gins. Based in London, Ginagain Spirits has earned the appreciation of numerous gin connoisseurs. Ginagain Spirits was founded by Rick Allen. Enjoying his childhood around the Central Valley in California, USA, Rick was fascinated by the vast array of orange groves and became interested in the citrus and fruit farms in the area. His travels to England, during the 1990’s inspired Rick to further his love of gin with California citrus inclusions. Time progressed and, with his wife Stephanie, they worked tirelessly on creating exceptional productions of fine, handcrafted, tiny batch, London Dry gins, utilising botanicals from global origins and California citrus, all to a great advantage.

Ginagain – Gin 01 (42% vol) has excellent overtones of California orange peel and cubeb pepper berries. Eleven ingredients are used to bring this gin to perfection, which has a hint of spice. I found this gin to be well-balanced throughout, from the bouquet, through the flavour and mouthfeel and then on to the palate’s delight. Indulgent and welcoming.

Ginagain – Gin 02 (42% vol) has organic California grapefruit, fresh basil and ginger root as the ingredients for this delectation. Notes of grapefruit are forward for this production, then, the basil inclusion is detected, adding a most pleasant herbal contribution. The ginger comes in, with its warmth and a spicy hint. I found this high-quality gin to be crisp and invigorating, with a very good balance. Delightful and exceptional.

No artificial ingredients, sweeteners or artificial flavourings are used in the productions of these London Dry gins. Their very informative website has some more interesting details and online ordering is easy too with orders being dispatched quickly and efficiently. A gin company with commitment and dedication to the grand end results.

LEST WE FORGET



On the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month of 1918 the First World War—the bloodiest war mankind has ever known—came to an end. It has been estimated that 16 million were killed in the conflict with a further 20 million wounded. Moira Michael, an American professor, was deeply moved by the plight of those who had lost loved ones or who had been injured in the War. She was looking for a way to raise money especially for those who were disabled through the fighting and then she read a short poem...

REMEMBRANCE DAY



The poem had been written by a young doctor called John Macrae who was serving on the Front Line with the Canadian Armed Forces in the Flanders region of Belgium. Just 15 lines long the poem “In Flanders fields” inspired Michael not only to write her own poem but to always wear a poppy in remembrance. The idea caught on and soon she was purchasing silk poppies to sell to friends and relations in order to raise funds for ex-servicemen in her home state of Georgia. Within two years she was campaigning for the poppy

to be recognised as the American national symbol of remembrance, a feat she achieved shortly afterwards. The use of the poppy to raise funds for ex-servicemen and their families spread to France and then—following the formation of the British Legion in 1921—it was introduced into the UK. Such was the enthusiasm with which the idea was greeted that consideration had to be given quickly as to how the paper poppies could be manufactured (the first ones had come from France). In 1922 Major George Howson MC took on the task of making the first batch of British poppies in a small factory on the Old Kent Road in London. His staff were five disabled ex-servicemen and his total capital was £2,000. The poppy was designed to be easy for disabled ex-servicemen to make and the same design is still used today (although different materials are now utilised and modern machinery is used in the manufacturing process. Within months the workforce had increased ten fold and by 1925 it became clear that the existing factory was too small and so new premises were found at Richmond in Surrey where today work continues in producing poppies. In its heyday the factory employed some 365 people and manufactured a staggering 45 million poppies a year. In order to give you an insight into the work that is actually done for Poppy Day, the national total for 2024 was a staggering £51.4 million.



Life on the Front Line was incredibly tough and for many men their life expectancy once they had reached the trenches was only a matter of months, if not days.



The Poppy Factory's employment consultants are based regionally throughout England and Wales and offer regular one-to-one contact with veterans and their families. Their remit is simply to do their utmost to help them on their journey towards employment. They help with CV writing, job search, support with training, exploring new opportunities, interview preparation, overcoming barriers and in-work support. Each year their specialist team are able to help hundreds of people who are facing some of the most challenging situations in the Armed Forces to take positive steps forward on their own.

The actual poppy plant is unusual insofar as when it drops its seeds at the end of each summer the seeds themselves do not germinate unless the soil on which they have fallen is disturbed. During the First World War large areas of Flanders, a region of Belgium were devastated with virtually no buildings, trees or other vegetation left standing. All that was left was a sea of mud, shell holes and abandoned trenches.

Nature, of course, has a way of regenerating itself and the following spring plants started to appear. The first of these were the poppies whose seeds having lain dormant for years started to appear following the disturbance to the ground. In 1915 the sight of a sea of red poppies inspired John Macrae, a doctor in the Canadian Armed Forces to write in his diary a short poem. He had just buried one of his close friends and the cross on the grave was surrounded by poppies. His poem—"In Flanders fields" was published in 'Punch' magazine and was to become one of the best known poems to be written during the First World War and it in turn inspired others to write other poems with the same sentiments. We now go back to the beginning of this article to Moira Michael who wrote a poem called "*We Shall Keep the Faith*":

***"Oh you who sleep in Flanders Fields
Sleep sweet—to rise anew!
We caught the torch you threw
And Holding high, we keep the Faith
With all who died.***

***We cherish, too, the poppy red
That grows on fields where valour led;
It seems to signal to the skies
That blood of heroes never dies
But lends a lustre to the red
Of the flower that blooms above the dead
In Flanders fields.***

***And now the Torch and Poppy Red
We wear in honour of our dead.
Fear not that ye have died for naught.
We'll teach the lesson that you wrought
In Flanders fields."***

This poem was published worldwide and the tradition of wearing the poppy "in honour of our dead" was born. This year the Royal British Legion's pledge is to raise in excess of last year's figure so please do support them in whatever way that you can and give generously.

Dance band drummer and singer, Teddy, had turned his vocalising duets with Pearl Carr into a much more successful money-spinner, with smash hits such as the ‘Eurovision ‘Sing Little Birdie’ (1959’.

Richard Nichols’ carefully researched book ‘Radio Luxembourg—the Station of the Stars’, (1983) commences in the 1920s and ‘30s, when international arguments over the possession of radio wavelengths were being, shall we say, ‘fiercely aired’.

Here, the BBC was outraged at the thought of long-wave competition. Even worse, “Dash it, those bounders in Normandy and Luxembourg are advertising. ‘Tea! Soap!’” To quote the BBC’s indignant Toytown resident on Children’s Hour, Mister Growser, Disgrrrraceful!”.

Luxembourg’s powerful transmitters were seized by Germany on the outbreak of World War Two. William Joyce, ‘Lord Haw-Haw”, tried to feed Britain with propaganda.

When this ‘Humbug for Hamburg’ started rambling on, presenters from the re-named ‘Radio International (Fécamp, Normandy), such as Roy Plomely and Bob Danvers-Walker, had to get back to England.

According to ‘My H. Samuel Everight Watch’ it was just in the nick of time!



Cats loved the extra warmth of valve radios. On the Light Programme, Music While You Work, the Charlie Katz appearances included Ocarina and 26 other instruments.
