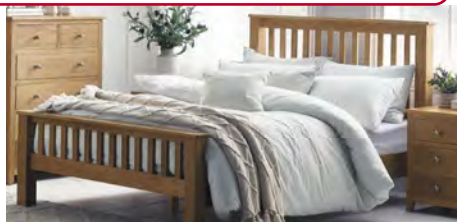

it's a fact!

- ★ In the mid 19th century the first passenger service long the canal between Wolverhampton and Birmingham via Coseley began. It was operated by Thomas Monk using the steam-packet '*Euphrates*'. The Coseley-Birmingham journey took 2½ hours.
- ★ In September 1833 the congregation at St James' Church in Gornal had to flee half way through a service when plaster from the ceiling near the tower came crashing down on their heads. There was a howling gale blowing at the time and it was thought that the tower was in imminent danger of collapse. A subsequent inspection of the tower did show that whilst it was in a very poor state of repair there was no immediate cause for concern.
- ★ In 1923 Coseley Education Committee started a centralised 'Boot Fund' to ensure that all children had suitable footwear for the winter. Although some schools already had set up similar funds it was decided that a centralised fund would be more appropriate. Within weeks subscriptions had amounted to £78/1s/1d and boots for 211 children had been ordered. "Up the hill" at Sedgley the local police had set up a similar fund and they were busy raising funds through whist drives, dances, concerts and street collections. By mid 1923 they had distributed over 400 pairs of best quality boots.
- ★ In August 1901 Thomas Marsh, a poultry dealer from Upper Gornal, was fined £2 at Bridgnorth for aiding and abetting the staging of a cock fight. A ring had been formed in a field and three battles were fought with two of the cocks killed. The main organisers were not, however, apprehended.

A NEW YEAR..OR IS IT?

Historically, New Year combines both pagan and religious beliefs and is the oldest celebration regularly undertaken by most of the world's population. However, that celebration does not always take place on 1st January with over half of the world celebrating on various other dates.

The first New Year celebrations came from the Babylonians about 4000 years ago when they celebrated the re-birth of the land at the beginning of Spring. The significance of 1st January was set by the Romans in 153 BC although it would seem that the date chosen was purely arbitrary. Despite the fact that this was a pagan festival the Christian church accepted this date as being a time to celebrate the start of a New Year and throughout the Western world this became the norm. However, other religions celebrate it on a very different dates.

Much of the Eastern Orthodox Church, for example, celebrates the New Year on 14th January when it also celebrates the circumcision of the infant Jesus. For members of the Coptic Orthodox Church the significant date is much later on in the year—11th September to be precise—when they celebrate Neyrouz. The Hebrew new Year (Rosh Hashanah) occurs any time between 6th September and 5th October with it falling on Saturday, 12th September this year.

The Chinese will celebrate the start of the Year of the Horse on 17th February whilst the Bengali New Year (Pohela Baisakh) is celebrated on Wednesday, 15th April.

The Islamic New Year commences on 17th June. Because the Muslim calendar is based on a 354 day lunar year the dates move forward about 11 days each year.

However, one of the most fascinating celebrations is in Sri Lanka where the Sinhala and Tamil New Year fall on Tuesday, 14th April. The actual end of the old year is determined by the state astrologer who also says when the New Year (Aluth Avurudhu) should commence. The two are not necessarily immediately after each other and the period between the two is known as Nona Gathe (the neutral period) when normal work is abandoned in favour of religious devotion.

Finally, of course, New Year would not be the same without resolutions being made. Even the Babylonians 4000 years ago are reported to have made promises to be better at various things—the most common resolution being to return borrowed farm equipment!

A recent survey showed that in the UK the five most popular resolutions are to lose weight, to quit smoking, to get out of debt, to get fit and to spend more time with the family. Unfortunately the same survey also showed that most people were only repeating the same resolution from the previous year as they had broken it within ten days of the New Year starting. Perhaps the most appropriate resolution is to stop making New Year's resolutions!

VENICE OF THE BLACK COUNTRY?

In a long article about Tipton in the Birmingham Daily Gazette in July 1868 local author J.C. Tildesley gave a fascinating insight into the town of Tipton in the mid 19th century. It seems that he was the very first person to refer to it (at least in writing) as “*the Venice of the Black Country*”.

The reason he gives for making such a remark was “*You cannot enter the town from any point of the compass without crossing a main channel, an arm or a basin*”. He then continued with that analogy by suggesting that “*King Coal has been the Doge of Tipton for many a long year.*”

Whilst he waxes lyrical about the similarities between the two places he then switches to matters of the mind and, in particular John Wesley whose religious fervour was clear to see. Tildesley interviewed a 90 year old woman—Mrs Paskin—who remembers being taken by her brother to hear Wesley preach. She described him as “*a stiff little man with a white wig and dressed in gaiters and black silk stockings*”. She said that he arrived on a brown horse and immediately addressed the crowd “*charming the worshippers to silence and before his sermon was ended many broke out into joyous smiling and repentant tears.*” Tildesley concludes by saying “*There is no equal to the Black Country, in Italy or anywhere else.*”

it's a fact!

- ★ In the 1920s and early 1930s the Red Lion Inn in Castle Street, Coseley was owned by brothers Henry and Benjamin Woodhouse who also ran the very successful Alma Brewery in Dudley. In total they owned some 15 pubs around the area as well as brewing for a number of other outlets.
- ★ In the 17th century it was usual for the sovereign to offer knighthoods to various people in each district. These offers, however, were very much a double-edged sword. To accept the offer would cost between £60 and £70 and bring with it a number of (unpaid) responsibilities. If the knighthood was refused though, a fine of £10 was levied. Local men who preferred to pay the fine included Alexander Wightwick of Wightwick, Thomas Dolman of Seisdon and Edward Hall of Sedgley.
- ★ During the English Civil War it was held that marriage was merely a civil contract between the parties without any religious significance. Such ceremonies were usually conducted by local magistrates and Sedgley parish records show that between 1653 and 1657 many marriages were conducted by a Justice Stone who also presided in criminal courts held in Wolverhampton, Sedgley, Seisdon and Kingswinford.
- ★ In October 1874 Mary Marsh of Dudley appeared in court accused of having been drunk in public. Unfortunately when she turned up for her case to be heard she was clearly drunk and was therefore locked up until she was sober. As she had been convicted of five similar offences during the previous 12 months the magistrates took a serious view of the charges and fined her 21 shillings plus costs for each offence (the original one and a second one for appearing in court whilst drunk).

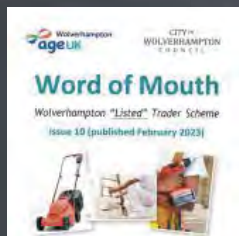

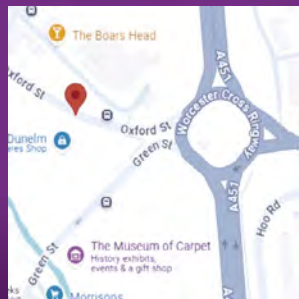

DID YOU KNOW?

The origin of the term 'Black Country' provides historians with something of a dilemma. Whilst the Oxford English Dictionary identifies its first use as being in a book written by J.C. Young and published in 1834 that reference is used merely as a description and, according to the OED the first time that the term was actually attached to a specific area was in an article in the 'Daily Telegraph' in December 1864. There are, however, at least two published sources of the term that pre-dates this—the earliest being a book called '*All Round The Wrekin*' by Walter White which was published in 1860.

Certainly at this time the region deserved such an epithet with over 440 collieries, almost 200 blast furnaces and more than 110 ironworks within a five mile radius of Dudley Castle.



It is said that at night the fires from the furnaces and forges could be seen from many miles away and

that by day a black cloud of smoke hung over the area. Indeed, so bad was the pollution that legend has it that for over nine months Dudley Castle could not be seen from the bottom of Castle Hill.

it's a fact!

- ★ July 1863 saw the worst suspicions of the Highway Board of Sedgley confirmed when it became clear that the collector in the Brierley area of Coseley had embezzled a substantial amount of money from the public purse. After a thorough investigation it was determined that Moses Hughes, the collector, had appropriated virtually all the money due for the highways over a nine year period. However, when the parish constable was sent to apprehend him it was found that he had sold up and moved to Australia.
- ★ In 1939, John James Benton, the licensee of the Courthouse pub in Sedgley, found himself in trouble with the law when he was fined £25 and disqualified from driving for being drunk in charge of a motor vehicle. At Audnam in Wordsley he drove into the back of a lorry reversing out of a garage onto the main road. He had ignored signals given by a man guiding the lorry driver saying that he *"thought he was waving at me, not telling me to stop"*. A police constable called to the scene of the accident described Benton as seeming *"very peculiar. He had his hands in his pockets in a half soaked way and did some blinking and nodding of his head"*
- ★ In the Dudley Herald of 15 February 1890 Samuel Timmins advertised something of a coup for his business. He negotiated with Samuel Salt of Kates Hill Brewery for them to supply Timmins' pub, the *Cape of Good Hope* in Tipton with their ales. The brewery had an excellent reputation for its beers and demand was far outstripping supply. As a result many pubs that wanted to offer the beer to their customers were unable to get supplies. Timmins therefore thought there was benefit in this and therefore widely advertised its availability.

INTERESTING FACTS ABOUTJANUARY

- 1569—11th:** The first state lottery was held in England, with tickets on sale at the West Door of St Paul's Cathedral in London.

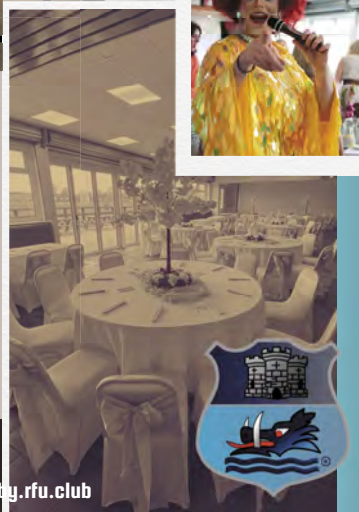
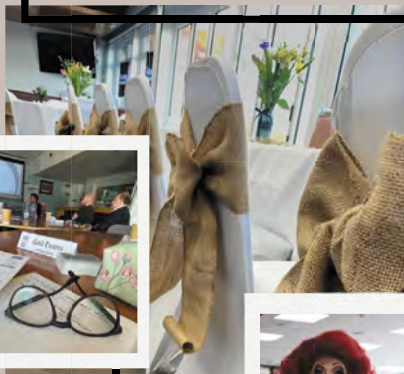

SHOESTRING Starring Trevor Eve, this was the story of how unemployed computer expert Eddie Shoestring becomes a private eye after appearing on a radio station. Listeners ring in to his show (called “*The Private Ear of Eddie Shoestring*”) and he takes up cases on their behalf. A total of 21 episodes were recorded in 1978 and 1980 with the last being a Christmas special starring Toyah Wilcox. After the second series Trevor Eve decided not to continue in the role and so the BBC commissioned a brand new series based on Jersey called *Bergerac* starring John Nettles. But do you remember the name of the fictional radio station on which Shoestring appeared?

- ★ In November 1901 a double inquest was held into the deaths of sisters Elizabeth (a schoolteacher) and Winifred (a factory worker) Frost of Tipton. The two young women were out selling tickets for a Unionist tea party but whilst going home in thick fog they apparently fell into the canal and drowned. A verdict of accidental death was returned on both.
- ★ In September 1918 Lottie Sheldon of Princes End was in court in Smethwick accused of travelling on the London & North Western Railway without having paid her fare and also giving a false name and address to a railway official. It seemed that she travelled from Tipton to Smethwick without a ticket and when asked to produce one she said that she had got on at Spon Lane and offered to pay from there. It was also clear that she gave a false name and address. The prosecutor asked that Sheldon be heavily punished as it was obvious that other munitions workers—like Sheldon—were also defrauding the railway company in the same way. Sheldon was fined 15/-.
- ★ News reached the local papers that on the evening of Wednesday 17th January 1798 that a Mr T Evans of Coseley was stopped by two men near Sedgley who then robbed him of a £50 note that he was carrying. He told the police that his attackers had passed him twice on the road and then he saw one lying under a hedge as he crossed a field. As he slowed down to see what had happened the other man leapt upon him and pressed a pistol to his chest, demanding that he hand over his valuables. Immediately after this robbery a substantial reward was offered for the detention of the robbers but no information was forthcoming and the crime was never solved.

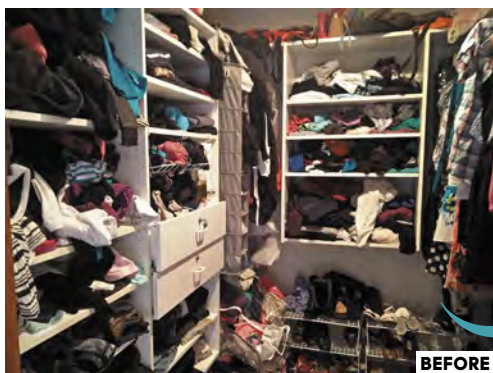

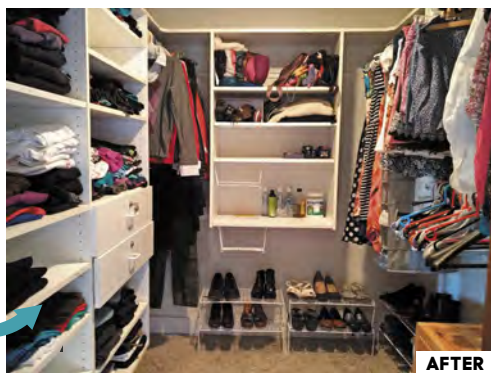

DEATHS BLAMED ON EARL

In 1855 seven Sedgley men died after a coal mine in Gornal collapsed. A total of 47 dependents were left.

An investigation showed that the disaster was caused by insufficient timber supports being placed along the shafts. The colliers had apparently complained about the situation, only to be told by the Earl of Dudley's overseer that he had been acting on orders "*from higher up*" in reducing the number of pit props. This revelation caused a considerable uproar locally and led to the Earl eventually giving each of the seven widows a guinea in compensation. Whilst this was gratefully accepted by the widows the controversy did not end there. The following Sunday the parson at Himley Church preached a sermon based on "*The Good Samaritan*" praising the Earl's generosity. This caused much annoyance amongst many of the local colliers who felt that the accident was caused by the



demands of the Earl for greater profitability from the mine. Demands were made for the person to be dismissed and some local shops even refused to serve him and his family. Eventually, to diffuse the situation the Earl announced that an independent safety survey of all his mines would be undertaken.

MONSTER FROM THE DEEP

Gornal readers may well recognise a very young Arthur Hale in this picture taken in February 1967. Sadly Arthur is no longer with us but his memory lives on with stories such as this. Although perhaps best known as a very useful cricketer (he once took all 10 wickets in an innings whilst playing for Himley Cricket Club) he was also something of a dab hand at angling. He is seen here with a pike that he caught at Forden in Montgomeryshire which tipped the scales at 21¼ lbs. It was 40" long and had a girth of 19". His monster catch was kept in the bath for a few days until he could arrange for it to be preserved and indeed for many years it was on display in a glass case in his living room, until he was persuaded to give it away.

No artificial colours, concentrates or flavourings are included in the production processes of the small batch delectations. The botanicals and casks used are from worldwide origins. The bottles are 100% recyclable and packaging is free of plastic, as the company is committed and dedicated to reducing their carbon footprint and the distillery has now become part of a global sustainability programme.

Abingdon London Dry Gin (40% vol) utilises eight botanicals in its make-up, to bring this hugely popular gin to fruition. Juniper forward, plus citrus and sweet spices are amongst the inclusions for this production. I found this gin to be outstanding, from the enticing bouquet, through the mouth's pleasure, for flavour and taste, to the palate's delight, which appreciates the long, extended finish. Perfect with an Indian tonic water and garnish.



Wild Oxon Rum (40% vol) from the Abingdon Distillery is a premium spiced rum production that has many devotees. White rum is fermented from cane sugar and the process which follows involves maceration with orange peel, plus toasted coconut chips, nutmeg, ginger and other spices, to produce this excellent pleaser. 31st January 1916: THE NIGHT THE ZEPPELINS BOMBED TIPTON



The Greensill house in Union Street, Tipton after a bomb from a zeppelin had exploded killing three generations of the same family.

George Onions (12) and Frederick Yates (9) as well as local estate agent Thomas Church and shoemaker Arthur Edwards.

Also killed were Benjamin Goldie, Elizabeth Cartwright, Annie Wilkinson, Daniel Whitehouse and Louisa York. Two others who died were William and Maud Fellows. Although not related they were planning to get engaged and were walking along the canal towpath in Bradley when a high explosive bomb exploded just in front of them. William was killed outright and Maud was to die a few days later in hospital. The photograph (above right) shows a scene from the canal in Tipton. The building on the extreme right is the Globe Inn which had all its windows blown out. Today of course there is no sign of the canal (it was filled in several decades ago).

A second Zeppelin—L19—came over Tipton about 12.20am on 1st February, attracted no doubt by the fires caused by the initial attack. Several bombs were dropped along Park Lane causing substantial damage to a number of buildings (including destroying the Bush Inn where the licensee and his family

On the night of 31st January 1916 two Zeppelin airships – L19 and L21—set out to bomb Liverpool but lost their way and ended up in the West Midlands.

Commanded by Max Dietrich, L21 unleashed a series of high explosive and incendiary bombs on both Waterloo and Union Streets in Tipton causing a considerable amount of damage and a number of casualties, before then dropping bombs along the nearby railway line and into Bradley. This was the first time that German airships had attacked the Black Country and there was a great deal of outrage, especially when it was revealed that three generations of the same family had perished in the bombing.

Whilst her husband Thomas Morris went to the cinema in Owen Street, his wife Sarah Jane took two of their children Nellie (8) and Martin (11) to visit her parents William and Mary Greensill at their home at 8 Union Street. When the bombs fell Thomas rushed back from the cinema only to find that his in-laws' house had been destroyed and they, his wife and two children lay dead in the rubble. Others who were killed included youngsters



had a narrow escape) but, fortunately, there were no further casualties. A final bomb was dropped on the canal bank close to the junction of Union Street and Factory Street although again no injuries were reported. From here L19 travelled to Walsall where it caused havoc, dropping a number of high explosive and incendiary devices on the town centre before then departing back across country towards the Channel and home.

Unfortunately for Loewe and his crew the airship suffered engine trouble and was then hit by anti-aircraft fire in Holland. With three of its four engines disabled L19 floated back over the North Sea where it finally ditched in the water. The crew were seen by a British trawler but the captain refused to pick up the stranded Germans and they perished at sea. This episode drew a great deal of condemnation of the actions of the trawler's captain. In memory of the victims of the Zeppelin raid Tipton Civic Society organised for a distinctive Blue Plaque (seen right) to be affixed to the wall of H.C. Pullinger & Son (now occupied by Shear Elegance). The building stands on the site of the Globe Inn which was one of those buildings that suffered substantial damage in the raid. In addition, the Society also arranged for a memorial Roll of Honour (above left) to be displayed in Tipton Library alongside the existing commemorative boards to those soldiers who lost their lives in the First World War.
