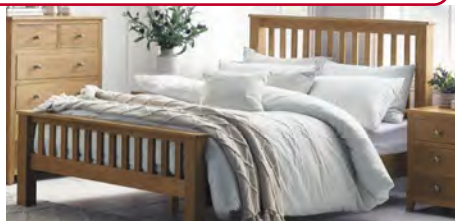

it's a fact!

- ★ In 1920 Lt. Col. F.R. Law of the South Staffordshire Regiment unveiled at the Wesleyan Church at Himley Road, Lower Gornal, a memorial to the 14 men and boys from the congregation who had lost their lives in World War 1. They were Granville Bowen, Leonard Brookes, William Collins, Ernest Evans, Harry Greenway, Ewart Hall, John Jordan, William H. Parkes, William Powas, Benjamin Simmons, Arthur Smith, Jas Timmins, Chas Timmins and Fred Worton. Also included at the memorial was a plaque to the 134 men who served in the conflict and returned home safely.
- ★ Ladies Walk in Sedgley was so named because it was the area of Sedgley Priory where the nuns were allowed to take exercise by walking up and down an enclosed pathway.
- ★ In February 1890 the Divorce Courts heard an unpleasant case of cruelty and adultery involving a Gornal couple. Mary Shaw petitioned against her husband William, claiming that he had attacked her on a number of occasions over the previous five years. During one of these attacks he hit her around the face with a stick of rhubarb and as a result she left him. Shortly afterwards she found out that a young woman was living with him and she was pregnant. This turned out to be Ellen Jane Pearson, who was an assistant in William Shaw's bakery. She gave evidence at the divorce hearing that she had been seduced by Shaw and that the impending child was his. When confronted with this testimony Shaw decided to drop his objection to the petition and a decree nisi was issued.

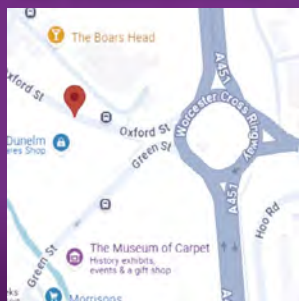

BRAINTEASERS

This month we are following George who throws up quite a few interesting Brainteasers all of his own! The answers can be found on page 56.

1. In his local pub George was given the chance to participate in a game of chance. For a £1 stake he was given the chance to throw three dice having first chosen a number from 1 to 6. If one of the dice shows his chosen number he gets £2 back, if two have his number he gets £4 and if all three show his number he gets £6. If none show his number he loses his stake. In the long run he wonders whether he is likely to win any money?
2. George writes out all the numbers from 1 to 100. How many times does he write the figure '9'?

it's a fact!

- ★ In the 1820s one of the most popular excursions locally was a Day At The Races at Penn Racecourse. Situated on Penn Common, the racecourse attracted good crowds especially from the Sedgley and Tipton areas as well as many of the best horses from the Midlands and Wales.
- ★ It was reported in May 1880 that a woman—Eliza Wilkes—from Princes End appeared at Bilston Police Court accused of stealing a box of clothes from Mary Ann Evans of Great Bridge. Evans travelled by train from Dudley to Great Bridge, having put the box in the guard's van for the journey. When she left the train at Great Bridge, however, the box was missing. Enquiries were quickly instigated and the box was found at Princes End. Later Wilkes was apprehended when she went to claim the box. At her court appearance, though, the only evidence against Wilkes was that when stopped she had jokingly said that “*she might as well claim it*”. The charge was therefore dismissed.
- ★ An unusual plea for justice was issued by Richard Veredie of Sedgley in 1594. He wrote to Sir Nicholas Barr saying “*Unto your Lordship that your orator Richard Veredie of Sedgley, Co. Staffs, labourer, being a very poor man having a wife and seven children made his living chiefly by letting out his horse worth 50 shillings to divers persons by the day. He let it out to Ann Gascon for four days to ride to Sturtyche (Stourbridge) at 8d a day and borrowed a saddle worth 7 shillings. From Sturtyche she went to Drytwche (Droitwich) many miles beyond to see James Moreland and his son and sold the said horse and stuff to them for 9 shillings. They refused to give them up*”. No information is available as to the outcome of the case.

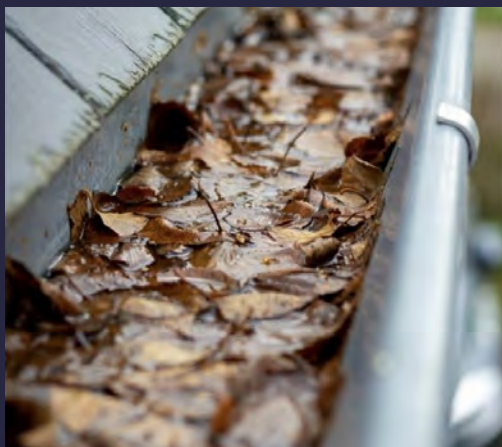

TRAM COMPANY'S CALL FOR CASH

In 1881 the Dudley, Sedgley & Wolverhampton Tramways Co. Ltd. issued a prospectus to attract investors to their proposed tramline.

It was advertised far and wide and the company quoted a number of statistics to try to persuade people to back it. They said that in recent times a total of £5,565,465 had been spent on installing tramways in Great Britain and that

113,007,103 passengers had been carried bringing in fares of £1,342,933—a return on capital employed of 23.59%. As a result, said the company, *“there is every reason, therefore to expect that the shares in the company will prove a highly profitable investment.”* The length of tramway proposed was six and a quarter miles and the company had calculated that there was an average 12,000 population per mile along the route. As Sedgley was one and a half miles from the nearest railway station the company believed that *“the tramways will supply a want long felt by the inhabitants especially by large numbers who, having business or employment in Dudley and Wolverhampton, are obliged to travel daily to and from those centres of commerce and manufactures and who are mainly of the class that readily avail themselves of a cheap and pleasant means of inter-communication.”*

IN TIMES GONE BY

For many years in the 1950s and early 60s, Gornal had one of the best Carnivals around the Dudley area and folks from miles around would come for the day—usually Whit Monday.

In 1961, for example, over a 1000 people flocked to the village to see more than 30 decorated floats together with children taking part in the '**Wild West Fancy Dress Competition**' parade around the village. The parade finished at the football ground in those days known as The Timmins Stadium—where a range of entertainment was laid on. In the year in question that included **whippet racing** (organised by the **Cradley Heath Whippet Club**), a Jazz Band Competition involving the **Widnes All Girls**, the **Lincoln Greens**, **Bootle Royal Ambassadors** and the **Brynmenyn Juniors** from Bridgend. Other attractions included the **Jones' Bros Funfair** plus a wide range of refreshment stalls run by various Committee members as well as ice cream and sweets from **Teddy Gray**.

The big attraction, however, were two performances by the '**Franollies Aquashow**', a troupe of "glamorous bathing beauties" whose show concluded with "the breathtaking **DIVE OF DEATH** by Roy Fransen (European and Fire Diving Champion) **ON FIRE – INTO FIRE**"! The Dive of Death featured Fransen diving into burning petrol floating on the water's surface. The act was usually saved until after dark, allowing the flames to add greater drama. The "On Fire, Into Fire" dive was performed—on occasions up to three times in a day—Fransen would wear a full body costume - a silver painted cotton boiler suit. He would douse himself with petrol and the moment he was set alight, he would dive 70 feet into the water. The money raised from the Carnival was donated to the Lower Gornal Athletic Football Club both to help in the upkeep of the stadium but also to subsidise the team which played, in those days, in the Worcestershire Football Combination League.

Other fundraising events organised by the Committee in 1961 included an open air professional **All-In Wrestling Show** on Saturday 24th June. The price of ring-side seats was 5/- whilst unreserved standing room was just 2/-.

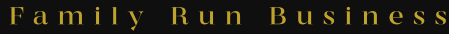

DID YOU KNOW?

That until about 1620 one of the main trades in the Sedgley and Coseley area was lock making, long before Willenhall became the country's centre for the manufacture of locks.

The last nailer in Lower Gornal was James Marsh who had his own nailshop in Hopyard Lane. He was born in 1825 into a family where his father and grandfather before him had followed the same occupation. He died in 1922.

Tom Griffiths, licensee of The Fountain in Temple Street, Lower Gornal not only won the Amateur Boxing Championship of England in 1893 but also won a gold medal for entering a lion's cage at a Dudley fairground! He also reputedly sparred with World Champion Jack Johnson. He died in 1947.

In the 13th century Sedgley was plagued by a band of thieves and bandits led by Robert de Dogmersfeid. In 1297, John de Sutton complained that Robert had "*entered his park at Seggesley and chased and killed forty bucks and does and cut down eight hundred and ninety nine oak trees*". At a subsequent court hearing Robert was found guilty of taking the deer but not of cutting down the trees. He was ordered to pay £20. Dogmersfeid and his men also attacked Dudley Priory and William, prior of Duddley accused him of being "*armed at the time taking two cloths of silver and gold, twelve silver spoons, twenty gold buckles, twelve gold rings, twelve carpet stands and twenty four other articles to the value of twenty marks*". For this Robert was fined £50—a punishment that did nothing to stop him going out and taking 40 sheep, 10 cows and 10 oxen from the Priory lands! History does not record what eventually became of Robert de Dogmersfeid, although there is some evidence of a warrant for his arrest on a charge of "*grievous injury*" eventually being issued.

HOLOCAUST—A LEGACY WE MUST NEVER FORGET

Dudley's annual Holocaust Commemoration Ceremony, organised by a committee which includes Dudley College Students Union, the Holocaust Education trust together with a small group of volunteers chaired by Councillor Keiran Casey, was held this year at the Assembly Hall at St James' Academy in Dudley on Friday, 23rd January.

The Organising Committee were proud to be able to introduce Peter Lantos BEM who was born in Hungary. He is a medical scientist who has made a huge contribution to scientific research in the UK and has written several books for adults and children about the Holocaust.

Peter was born on 22 October 1939 in Makó which is a provincial town in southeastern Hungary. His maternal family were owners of a timber yard which was managed by two uncles who lived in adjoining villas on the property. In contrast, Peter's immediate family resided in a modest annex at the back. Following the German occupation of Hungary in 1944, a wave of antisemitic laws was enacted and Peter's 18 year old brother was taken away for forced labour and sadly never returned. Shortly afterwards, the family was forced into the ghetto in Makó where they remained for several weeks. At the age of five in the summer of 1944, Peter was deported to Bergen-Belsen in northern Germany with his parents—simply because they were Jewish. Like many other children Peter's dreams were shattered by that action—he lost his toys, his home and his friends and found himself thrust into a world full of disease, hunger, cruelty and starvation and was to witness first hand the death of those around him.

On arrival Peter became Prisoner 8431 and he found himself and his mother cruelly separated from his father. Life was unbearable with starvation and disease all around him—there was no place for children to play or form any kind of friendship. Instead they were forced to witness



constant cruelty and death. Though Bergen-Belsen was not an extermination camp—there were no gas chambers—it became a 'hell on earth' through starvation, disease and relentless suffering. Peter's father died of starvation just four weeks before the British Army liberated Bergen-Belsen on 15 April 1945. After surviving the camp, Peter and his mother returned to Hungary but it was far from a joyful homecoming—21 members of his family had been murdered and his brother died of typhoid fever only a month before their return. Having lived through this experience Peter was driven to become a doctor but his plans to study medicine were at first blocked by the Communist authorities who labelled him 'alien class'. It was his mother's overall devotion which made her challenge the classification and he was eventually allowed to pursue his studies. After qualifying he received a research fellowship in 1968, which enabled him to work in London.

Over the years there have been many poignant memories shared by an array of Holocaust survivors and the Commemoration is always an extremely moving event. It allows everyone to honour the memory of those who died in the Holocaust and it goes some way to helping people to understand the evils of racism and prejudice and where this can lead to. It is now left to us all to oppose intolerance and hatred in whatever form, wherever it is found. it's a fact!

- ★ In 1922 W.H.N. Knight, the “police court missionary and probation officer for Wolverhampton, Bilston, Willenhall, Brierley Hill and Sedgley” gave a report to the local magistrates about his activities the previous year. He said that he had visited 1157 homes conversed with 467 prisoners in the cells at police stations, received 349 letters and attended 309 police court sittings.
- ★ In 1877 Edwin Douglas (15) was charged with using a catapult to break a window on Wolverhampton Road, Sedgley and when he appeared in court he was fined 20/- plus costs or one month imprisonment in default. The magistrates said that this was the latest incidence of a catapult being used to cause damage and that they wished that shopkeepers would cease selling them.
- ★ Metal theft is no new crime—in January 1878 the offices of Bannister & Foster, coalmasters of Deepfields were forcibly broken into and a large quantity of brasses weighing about a hundredweight were stolen. This came only a week after the ironworks next door had also been raided and a large amount of scrap iron stolen.
- ★ In 1722 Josiah Sheldon gave the rent obtained from a piece of land he owned to provide bread every week for 12 poor widows living in Tipton. The land (about 2½ acres) proved to be much more valuable than first thought and the annual income of five guineas in rent was overshadowed by the value of the coal beneath its surface. In 1797 the rights to the coal were sold for £1,052 and the proceeds lent to the churchwardens of the parish church who were at that time rebuilding the church. The interest from the loan was then used to continue to pay for the bread.

Clutter usually enters our lives quietly, a special-offer purchase here, a sentimental item there, a box we never quite get around to sorting.

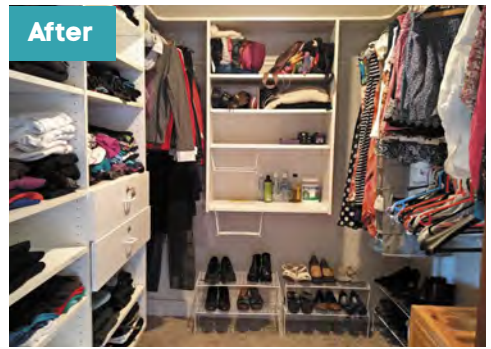
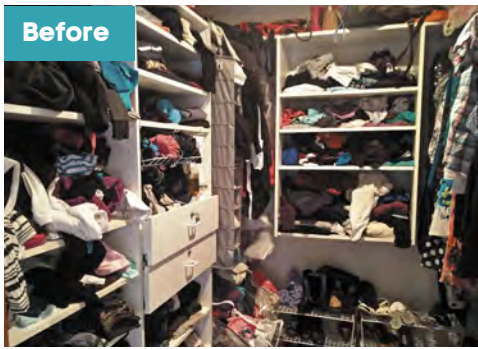

In a culture that celebrates consumption and busyness, simplifying is more than a lifestyle choice; it's an act of self-care. Decluttering can offer a path to a happier, more intentional life, one clear surface and one conscious choice at a time.

FEBRUARY FACTS

It was named after Februa, a Roman festival of purification (which is probably the basis of spring cleaning)

Later it was called Sol-monuth or 'Mud Month' in Old English.

Shakespeare only mentions February once in all his plays—'Much Ado About Nothing'.

In the USA February hosts a long list of special events including Pet Dental Health Month, Hot Breakfast Month, Jobs in Golf Month, National Women Investors Month and National Shopping Carts To The Supermarkets Month.

February's official flower is the primrose.

February, of course, has the distinction of being the month of St Valentine's Day. It has been suggested that St Valentine should be regarded as the patron saint of florists and chocolate manufacturers. He is actually the patron saint of bee-keepers, epilepsy, young people and the plague.

This year Shrove Tuesday (generally called Pancake Day) occurs on 17 February. It is officially the last day before fasting for Lent which commences on Ash Wednesday.

Although it is hard to pinpoint the exact first celebration of Valentine's Day as a celebration of love, it likely occurred in Paris in the 1400s. The English and French associated mid-February with that of the season of birds' mating, making it an appropriate time to celebrate romance.

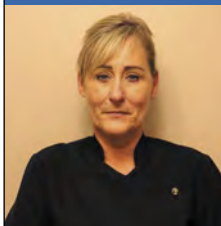

A MATCHING PAIR

The 1930s saw two major buildings who shared the same name appear in the centre of Sedgley and Coseley. These were the Clifton cinemas.

Born in Birmingham during 1885 Sidney Clift was a solicitor who married into the cinema industry as his father-in-law ran the Empire at Stirchley. Clift acquired a couple of existing cinemas and then started to build his own 'super-cinemas'. The first of these was in Walsall in 1936 and the second opened a year later in Sedgley. Seating just over 1000 filmgoers, the cinema in Sedgley was frequently packed out in its early days and a further Clifton was commissioned and built at Lye. The final Clifton to be constructed was at Coseley in 1939, very shortly before the outbreak of the War.



Today the Clifton in Sedgley is no longer a cinema but a pub, part of the J.D. Wetherspoon chain.

Both local Cliftons hosted variety shows and pop concerts in the 1950s and early 1960s but with the cinema audiences starting to decline in the late 1960s and early 70s the death knell for both buildings started to toll. In 1963 the Coseley cinema was demolished to be replaced by a shopping centre and bowling alley (which never materialised) and in 1978 the Sedgley cinema was turned firstly into a bingo hall and then, once the bingo 'bubble' had burst into a pub in which capacity it is still today extremely popular.

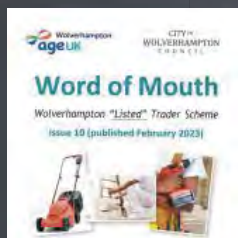

FEBRUARY

The British weather fluctuates dramatically at this time of the year and we experience conditions from mild through to freezing temperatures and snow whilst at other times bright sunshine and cold nights. All this is "confusing" to our traditional semi-dormant plant growth habits. Some plants are starting to bud up to four weeks earlier than 5-10 years ago but are then struck by frost damage. Moreover, we are finding that traditional gardeners are having to change their working plans for the garden to potentially give plants a longer growing season due to the unknown temperatures that we are experiencing.

Cleaning greenhouses, sheds and tools alongside washing pots, ordering sundries and planning for the forthcoming season can be undertaken come rain or shine, warm or cold. Consider your growing plans for the display you're looking for versus your current plant stock. To supplement home grown plant cuttings start to raise seedlings at the end of the month and look at enhancing your plant range by visiting local nurseries where you can see the quality of plant stock before you purchase. They may also have opening seasonal offers and be able to offer useful advice and knowledge rather than just ordering online.

Whilst working on the garden in "good weather" days, cleaning and tidying the borders or turning over allotments and vegetable patches can all be done but please don't forget that the birds and wildlife will need food on both good and bad days whilst ponds will need to be defrosted regularly to release the build up of gasses underneath the ice.

OTHER JOBS TO BE DONE:

- From mid-February onwards sow tomato and cucumber seeds for greenhouse growing.
- Plant out end of February/early March garlic and shallots
- As long as the ground is not frozen consider sowing broad beans, carrots and parsnips early and plant beetroot and Jerusalem artichoke tubers.
- In warm greenhouses, or under cloches, set out seeds for salad onions, lettuces, radish, peas and spinach.

It will be your last chance to prune winter apples, pears, medlars and quinces.

- Prune currant bushes, autumn-fruiting raspberries and prune back newly planted raspberries to about a foot high.
- Check the acidity of your soil, if too acidic add some lime.

Above all else, don't forget to keep smiling—the summer months are getting closer all the time!!!

it's a fact!

- ★ It was reported in January 1903 that the lifeless body of a local farmer, George Brooks, had been found in Baggeridge Wood. It seems that he had left his club in Sedgley shortly before 11.00pm in order to walk home. He regularly took a short cut through the wood but on this occasion it seems that he fell and, unable to get up, perished in the intense cold of the night. His body was not discovered until mid morning the following day.
- ★ There was a heated debate in the Sedgley Council chamber in January 1962 over a proposed 5/- a week increase in council house rents. Labour councillors suggested that the state of some of the houses was so bad that an increase could not be justified. Conservative councillors, however, said that the increase was needed. One of their members, Cllr Bruce Meredith, suggested that *"if they don't want to pay the extra 5/- they should get out and buy a private house."* He went on to say that in the majority of council houses there were two incomes and that there was an increasing number of new cars on the council estates. *"If they don't like the increase they know what they can do"* he said. His comments caused an uproar in the chamber with Labour councillors howling at him. Once the furore had died down a vote was taken and the resolution to increase the rents was passed by 12 votes to 8.
- ★ In the 1950s Mitchell Mitchell was a boxer who fought under the name *"The Coseley Kid"*. Strangely he was from Ilford in Essex and does not seem to have any connection with Coseley. If anyone has any information they would like to share I would be happy to do a piece on *"The Coseley Kid"* in a future edition.
