1. In his local pub George was given the chance to participate in a game of chance. For a £1 stake he was given the chance to throw three dice having first chosen a number from 1 to 6. 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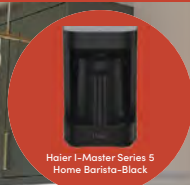
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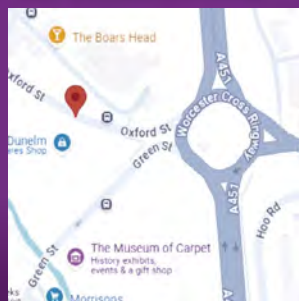
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it's a fact!

- ★ In September 1933 the Earl of Dudley disturbed a burglar at Himley Hall. On hearing a noise during the night the Earl armed himself with a revolver and went to investigate. The thief escaped with a number of small silver items by diving through a drawing room window.
- ★ The derivation of the name of local villages is an interesting topic in itself. "Kinver", for example, is thought to come from "Chere Vere" meaning Royal Rose whilst "Bobbington" takes its name from Bobba The Saxon who founded the habitation well before the Norman Conquest in 1066.
- ★ Wherever you look in Trysull there seems to be something of historical importance. The bridge across the Smestow Brook is particularly unusual because it is Grade II Listed by English Heritage. The bridge was built in the late 18th century and is described as being *"of red brick with ashlar dressings and comprises three segmental arches with alternate raised voussoirs, two keeled ashlar cutwaters and plain parapet string to coped parapet. Abutments sweep forward."* Halfway across the bridge is the sign seen above right. The Motor Car Act 1903
- ★ In October 1931 Kinver Parish Council wrote to the Traffic Commissioners for Staffordshire requesting that they allow a more frequent bus service between Kinver and Stourbridge. The Commissioners, though, refused saying that such an increase could not be justified.



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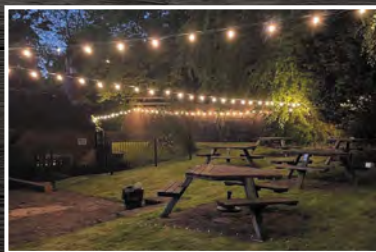


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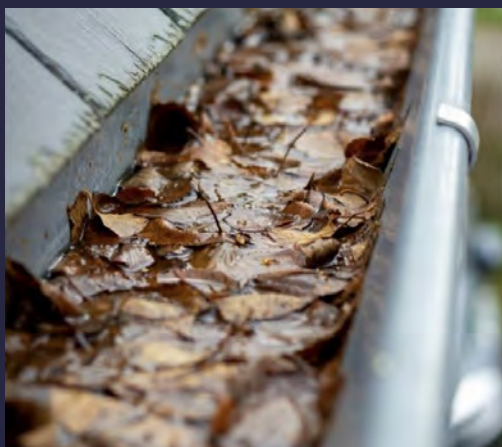
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THE BILLY BUNN MYSTERY

One of the greatest mysteries in Wombourne is who (or indeed what) was 'Billy Bunn' who had the lane named after him. Many people (including us) have attempted to track down the mysterious 'BB' but with little luck. In desperation we searched for any Billy Bunn's that we could find.

The first one that we found was a 1950s singer (seen right) who had a couple of hit records with his group "*His Buddies*". His style was somewhat unique—he was a natural soprano—and he caused great concern by disappearing shortly after having his first hit "*I need a shoulder to cry on*".

The second Billy Bunn is the President of the North Carolina Pecan Growers Association. The pecan tree (a member of the hickory family) is used both to produce nuts and wood for the manufacture of furniture and flooring.

Next on our list was the skipper of the boat "*Putford Provider*", one of the trawlers from Newlyn that featured in the *Trawler Wars* series on TV. And finally we found a Billy Bunn who is President of the "*Lost-in-Space Hunting Club*". This Club takes its name from a cult American TV series which revolved around aliens hunting down humans. Today the Club's main prey is deer. Of course, none of this brings us any closer to identifying Wombourne's Billy Bunn but who knows, perhaps one day the mystery will be explained...





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THE SAD CASE OF THE WOMBOURNE REGISTRAR

In 1923 the village of Wombourne was stunned when its much liked and respected Registrar of Births & Deaths was arrested for attempting to murder his wife.

Just before Christmas Arthur John Edwards was at home in Penn with his wife Harriett and their three children (the youngest of whom was only 10 months old). As they prepared to go to bed Edwards suddenly attacked his eldest daughter Cecily (15) and his wife with a razor. Whilst Cecily suffered only a minor injury Harriett had a deep cut to her throat which later needed stitches.

Luckily the screams of the two women were heard by nearby carol singers who hauled Edwards off his wife. He was clearly very distressed and repeatedly said *"It must be done before midnight...before midnight. I meant to do them all and myself as well"*. He was arrested and when he appeared at Wolverhampton Police Court the Medical Officer at Birmingham Prison stated that he believed Edwards to be insane. He also reported that a few years earlier Edwards had been a resident in Stanford Asylum.

An application was made to the Home Secretary to have Edwards committed to a mental hospital but this was refused and the trial had to take place. Although at the trial Harriett Edwards did not give evidence against her husband he was found guilty but insane. He was sentenced to be detained indefinitely.

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INTERESTING EVENTS IN...FEBRUARY

- 2nd (1665)** British forces captured New Amsterdam, which was the centre of the Dutch colony in Manhattan, North America. After its capture, New Amsterdam was renamed 'New York' in honour of the Duke of York who was its new governor.
- 4th (2004)** Mark Zuckerberg created the Facebook social media platform whilst he was a sophomore at Harvard. The following day over a thousand people had registered which was only the beginning. Today Facebook has more than 2.91 million monthly users.
- 6th (1952)** King George VI died leaving his daughter Princess Elizabeth to take the throne and become Queen Elizabeth II.
- 11th (1975)** Margaret Thatcher became the first female leader of the Conservative Party. A few years later in 1979 she also became the first female Prime Minister, serving until 1990. Due to her uncompromising politics and leadership style, she quickly became known as the 'Iron Lady'.
- 15th (1965)** Legendary singer and pianist Nat King Cole died in his sleep at St. John's Hospital in Santa Monica, California, at the age of 45. He was thought to have suffered from lung cancer. He was best known for his music including hits such as 'Unforgettable', and "I Love You" and also made history in 1956 when he became the first black host of a variety series *The Nat King Cole Show*.
- 29th (1692)** Three women—Sarah Good, Sarah Osborne and Tituba—were accused of witchcraft, thus marking the beginning of the Salem Witch Trials in Salem Village, colonial Massachusetts. The trials led to the execution of 20 'witches' with more dying in prison before and after the trials.
- 26th (1797)** The Bank of England issued the first ever £1 note which continued to be printed until 1984. It was withdrawn in 1988 in favour of the £1 coin.



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it's a fact!

- ★ At the Assizes held during the summer of 1863 the Earl of Dudley took out an action against one of his tenants, John Beddard of Penn Wood Farm. Beddard was accused of removing straw and dung from the farm without permission and of neglecting the property. The jury, however, found that the case had not been proved and found Beddard not guilty.
- ★ A local farmer—George Whitehouse of Hinksford Farm—appealed against an enforcement notice that had been served on him by Seisdon Rural Council in January 1974. The Council said that the farm vehicle from which he was selling potatoes, turnips and sprouts should be classified as a building and as such it did not have planning permission. The appeal before the Department of Environment Inspector also heard from Staffordshire County Council that the roadside stall was causing traffic problems as customers were parking on the nearby verge. The appeal was rejected.
- ★ Stourton Castle on the outskirts of Kinver dates back to the late 11th century when it was a Royal Hunting Lodge used by the King (William II) when he came to Kinver Forest to hunt deer and other game.
- ★ In April 1849 at Staffordshire Assizes Thomas Lewis pleaded guilty to stealing a wheelbarrow, the property of Joseph Woodcock of Kingswinford, for which he was sentenced to two months imprisonment. Whilst in court, however, an extra charge of stealing a wheelbarrow from James Noakes of Wombourne was put to him. Again he pleaded guilty and was sentenced to a further two months in prison.

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DID YOU KNOW?

Himley Country Hotel is based on the old village schoolhouse and room originally built by the Earl of Dudley to educate the children of his estate workers.

No-one is quite sure why Wombourne's parish church is dedicated to St Benedict Biscop. He lived between 628 and 690 AD in the North East of England and was Abbot of Wearmouth. He was a great scholar and his most famous pupil was the Venerable Bede who, amongst other things, introduced the BC/AD form of dating.

One of the first factories to have been established in Wombourne was the safe-making works of Sedgley businessman Joe Timms in 1926.

For a short time Seisdon was the home of part of the British car industry. In the 1950s Jack Turner, a Welshman, set up a garage at the Old Smithy in the village from which he acted as chief mechanic to look after the racing cars of various wealthy drivers who 'privateered' in motor races. After a while he decided to start building his own design of sports car using a Lea Francis engine and, following considerable success with this, he decided to go into full production. He moved first to premises in Merridale Street, Wolverhampton before outgrowing those and transferring to a new facility at Pendeford Airport. In 1955 he launched his first production model, a 2-seater with an Austin A30 engine. To beat purchase tax he sold them in kit form. Almost half of his production was exported to the US and a number of celebrities of the day purchased them (Petula Clark bought two). However, production ceased in 1965 and the company, Turners Sports Cars, disappeared in 1966.



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PENN—NOT A VERY NICE PLACE TO LIVE!

Before the residents of Penn take exception to our headline we would make it clear that we are talking about the mid 18th century when, it seems, there was a certain amount of lawlessness about the area. We have come across two stories that illustrate this fact:

In February 1749 a number of newspapers throughout the country told a blood-thirsty story of how Thomas Rowbotham, parish clerk to Penn, was attacked and almost killed on his way back from Wolverhampton Market one evening. He was almost home when he was stopped by a man called Thomas Daw who, without any provocation *“knock’d him down, kick’d him and beat him with a knotty stick that he had got for that purpose in a most inhuman manner”*. Worse was to come for as, when Rowbotham tried to escape, he was caught and Daw knocked him down again and *“hack’d his head in a terrible manner with a stone, bit off his ears and stamp’d upon him with all the violence imaginable”*. The victim of this terrible assault tried to call out but was presented by Daw attempting to force open his mouth and pluck out his tongue before filling it with dirt. Fortunately for Rowbotham a passing horse and carriage scared Daw enough to make him flee, leaving him

almost lifeless. Shortly afterwards, however, his groans were heard by a couple of passersby who carried him to the White Hart Inn at Penn. So badly injured was he that he could not be moved from the pub for three weeks.

The second event happened just two years later when a man and his wife were attacked not far from the same site. This was about midday when Joseph Bates and his wife were walking back from church and three men jumped out of the hedgerow and attacked the couple. One man held Mrs Bates whilst the other two started punching and kicking Joseph. When he was prone on the ground one man held a knife to his throat and threatened to kill him if he failed to return the horse that he had stolen. After taking all the money he had on him the three men ran away. Bates said, however, that it must have been a case of mistaken identity as he did not have a horse—stolen or otherwise.

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10 THINGS YOU (PROBABLY) DIDN'T KNOW

About Valentine's Day

The first recorded Valentine was written by Charles, Duke of Orleans in 1415, while he was imprisoned in the Tower of London after the Battle of Agincourt.

Valentine's Day is of course synonymous with a red heart. However, this was not always the case...the heart shape we know and love today was not originally linked to emotions of any sort. It was believed to represent the shape of a seed or even the human body. In ancient times, the symbol was often used in art and literature for a variety of meanings including fertility and life. It was not until much later, during the Middle Ages, that the heart began to be associated more with love and passion.



Chocolate, of course, is a major player in Valentine's Day. However, it only became popular in the 19th century and all thanks to Richard Barrow Cadbury who was born 22nd March 1835 and was the second son of the Quaker John Cadbury who was the founder of Cadbury's. Richard came up with the forward-thinking idea of packaging chocolates in heart-shaped boxes specifically for Valentine's Day. This move quickly gained popularity and soon the tradition of giving chocolates as a symbol of love became widespread. The rest is, as they say, history.

The Victorians considered it bad luck to sign your name in a Valentine's Day card. Instead they would mysteriously sign their love letters 'XOXO'.

The saying 'to wear one's heart on one's sleeve' comes from a medieval Valentine's Day ritual that saw the names of local spinsters dropped into a hat for a romantic raffle! It was said that each of the town's bachelors would then pick a name, pin it to his sleeve for a week and take that lady as his Valentine. Apparently many couples became husband and wife seven days later!

In the 18th century it was believed that women who received the most Valentine's Day cards would marry within the year. This superstition suggested that the number of cards symbolised a woman's desirability and foretold a speedy engagement.

In the 17th century and thanks to Oliver Cromwell and the Puritans, Valentine's Day faced a brief ban in England. They opposed anything to do with the celebration of romance and other forms of frivolity and they sought to suppress it because it was deemed to be sinful and overly indulgent. Lucky for lovers everywhere that the ban was short-lived and was reinstated when the monarchy was restored in 1660.

There are a few underlying superstitions about Valentine's Day. One that we came across was most definitely aimed at the lady of the relationship. If a woman spotted a sparrow she would marry someone poor... if she saw a goldfinch she would marry a millionaire... if she saw a robin flying in the sky then that would suggest that she would end up with a sailor...if she saw a blackbird then that would mean she would marry a clergyman...if she saw a flock of doves then that would promise a long and happy marriage. However, beware of seeing an owl or woodpecker first thing in the morning as apparently this would mean that you are destined to stay single.



When you think of Cupid you probably come up with the image of a naked cherub shooting arrows of love. However, in Roman mythology, Cupid was the God of love and was known as Eros in Greek mythology—he

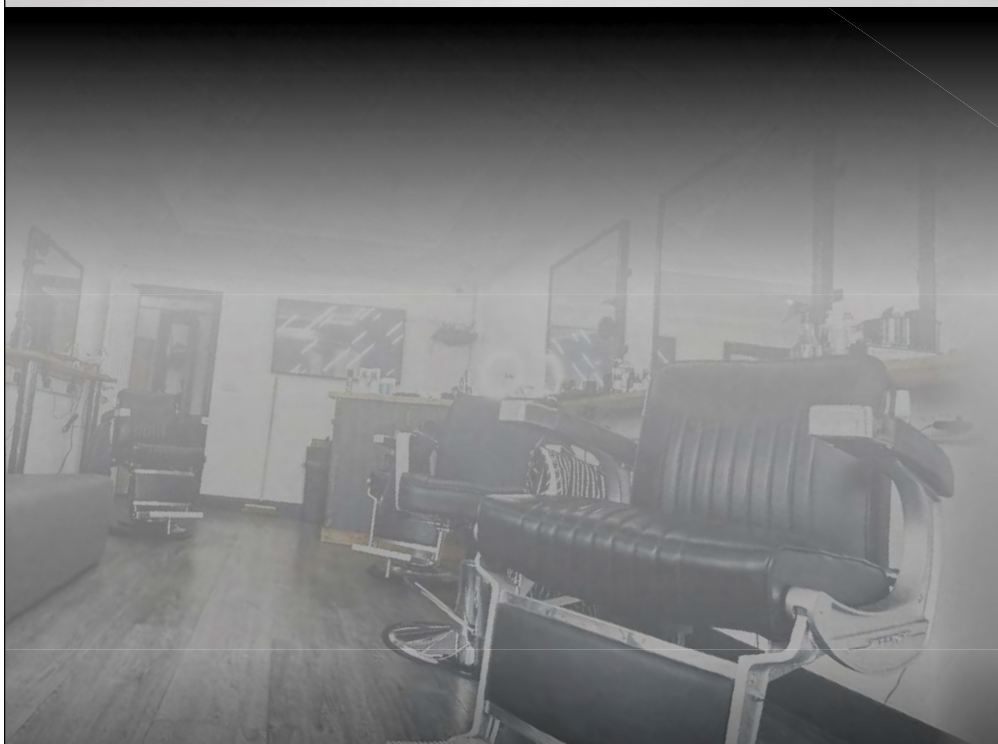
was seen as a handsome immortal who used gold arrows to spark love and interfere with the emotions of Gods and men...

The invisible weight of “too much”

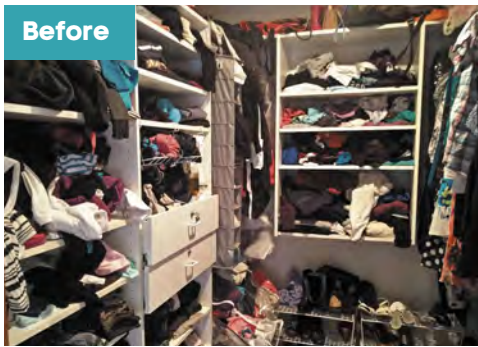
Clutter usually enters our lives quietly, a special-offer purchase here, a sentimental item there, a box we never quite get around to sorting.

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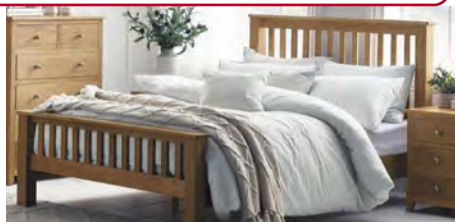
★ In October 1867 an extraordinary discovery was made just outside Kinver. A group of workmen were drawing water from a long disused pit shaft when they hauled up the sleeve of a woman's dress. They delved further and brought up a small bag which contained the corpse of a child. When they opened the bag the lifeless body fell to pieces as it had been immersed in water for an estimated 18 months. A brick had been tied to the bag to ensure that it had sunk. At the inquest into the unnamed baby's death the coroner asked that further investigations should be made of the pit shaft to see whether any additional evidence could be obtained. The workers returned but were horrified to find not one but two additional bodies at the bottom of the shaft. Whilst the cause of the death of the first two victims could not be established it was clear that the third child—a boy of about six years of age—had been murdered. Police enquiries were started but the children were never identified, although members of a Kinver family who had moved away over a year before were suspected.

★ Under the Shops Act 1950 all shops were required to close for one half day per week ("early closing") unless special dispensation was given by the local council. In November 1966 Staffordshire County Council decided to suspend this order on 21st-24th December in certain areas including Seisdon (but not Kinver) to enable shops to take advantage of the pre-Christmas rush. One of the reasons given for this decision was that bad weather in mid and late November had put off many people from venturing out and some shop owners had expressed fears that they would be bankrupted unless trade picked up.

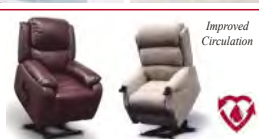
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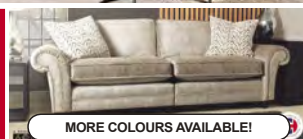

- ★ In November 1878 there was a daring attempt to burgle Enville Hall (seen here right) which was the home of Lord Stamford. As Lord and Lady Stamford were getting ready for dinner in their respective dressing rooms his Lordship's valet came across an intruder who suddenly pulled out a revolver, threatening to kill the servant. Fortunately the valet reacted instantly and ducked into a side room, locked the door, opened the window and started to shout for help. As the alarm had been raised the intruder took to his heels and fled through a window. He—together with two accomplices—were seen running over the lawns to the coach road where a horse and cart were awaiting them. Although no-one was arrested for the attempted burglary it was assumed that it was a professional gang possibly from out of the area.
- ★ Mystery stories abound around Wombourne but the strangest one we have heard is the disappearing rabbit of Wombourne Park. A driver hit a white rabbit as it ran across the road. The driver got out and sure enough there was a dead rabbit in the middle of the road. He put the dead rabbit in his boot in order to dispose of it later—but when he got home it had mysteriously vanished!
- ★ Above the door of Trysull Manor is an intriguing inscription "*Stranger should this catch your eye, Do a favour passing by, Bless this house ere you be gone, And it shall bless you passing on*".



FOOD FOR THOUGHT: *YOGURT AND KEFIR*

A review by Trevor Langley



Yogurt is a semi-solid dairy (or can be a non-dairy) production utilising fermented milk to create a product that is rich in nutrients, including calcium and protein, plus probiotics, that assist the health and well-being of bones, gut and/or severity from viruses. Greek-style productions are usually recognised to have a thicker consistency and higher protein level.

Multi award-winning Tims Greek Family Yogurts (Est. 1949) are inspired by their Greek family recipes and have the finest natural ingredients, plus gut-friendly bio-live cultures and fresh, pasteurised British milk combining, to bring really great tastes to fruition, with dairy goodness and creamy textures to the fore. Founded by the Timotheou family, their amazing story developed and now 'Tims', as the brand has become known, creates productions that continue to gain prestigious awards. Tims Greek Family Natural Yogurt I found to be very delicious on its own and also when accompanying fruits. Delights around the table were experienced. Other comments were that this product is so versatile it can be drizzled with honey and also used as a favourable dip, topping or dessert, as required. Other very popular choices include Blackcurrant, Honey, Caffè Latte, Mango, Raspberry and Vanilla flavoured yogurts.

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MOURNING THE “QUEEN OF THE MIDLANDS”

When Georgina, Countess of Dudley, died in February 1929 a huge crowd assembled at St Michael’s Church, Himley to pay their respects to a lady who was much loved in the area.

She was the third of eight daughters of Sir Thomas Moncrieffe and the second wife of William, the first Earl of Dudley. She was renowned for her beauty (as a child she was painted by Millais who declared that she was the most beautiful model he had ever painted) and her down-to-earth attitude. During the Boer and First World Wars she worked for the Red Cross in London caring for injured soldiers as well as spending time at the Guest Hospital in Dudley. She was also very practical and compiled “*The Dudley Book of Cookery and Household Recipes*” which included some 500 separate recipes for all occasions.

She died at Pembroke House in Richard Park, a residence granted by King Edward following the death of her husband in 1885. Her body was brought back to Himley for burial. The pall bearers were eight old servants of the Dudley estate and floral tributes included one from Queen Maud of Norway.

ANOTHER AID CONVOY STORY

The very first humanitarian aid convoy I drove in during my ten years as a member of the German Red Cross consisted of twelve aid lorries plus our mobile kitchen lorry. We left Bremen at 1800 hours on Friday with two drivers to each truck, driving through the night all the way south into Austria. The convoy was several hundred metres long and the kitchen lorry, which could travel faster independently, went on ahead to meet up with the main group at pre-arranged stopping points. At these we were able to refuel the lorries and ourselves. Breakfast on the Saturday morning always amused me as it consisted of a steak sandwich, chocolate cake and copious amounts of coffee.

Approaching the city of Linz on Saturday afternoon before we entered the city, we were met in a lay-by that was big enough to take all the lorries and had been closed off for us by the Austrian police. We were then provided with a police escort front and rear into the city and with all our blue lights on we sailed through red traffic lights and, where necessary, even driving on the wrong (left) side of the road! The night was spent in an Austrian Red Cross centre in the city. Sunday morning we were off again to get to the Hungarian border. Most lorries, unless they were carrying perishable goods, were generally not allowed on the German and Austrian motorways at weekends but we had special dispensation as we were carrying humanitarian aid. Going through the international borders was always strange as it didn't matter if there were twelve trucks in the convoy or, as I did on occasion a single truck, it always took four hours to go through customs. In the very rear of each truck we also had a few "goodies" such as children's toys in case any of the eastern European border guards decided they wanted to check our loads. In that event you simply offered the guard something for his own children which invariably had the desired effect

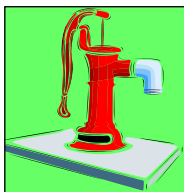

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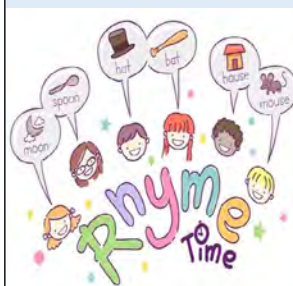
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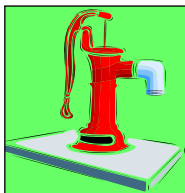
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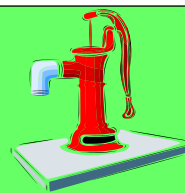


Warstones Library are offering Rhyme Time for children every Tuesday from 2.30-3.00pm

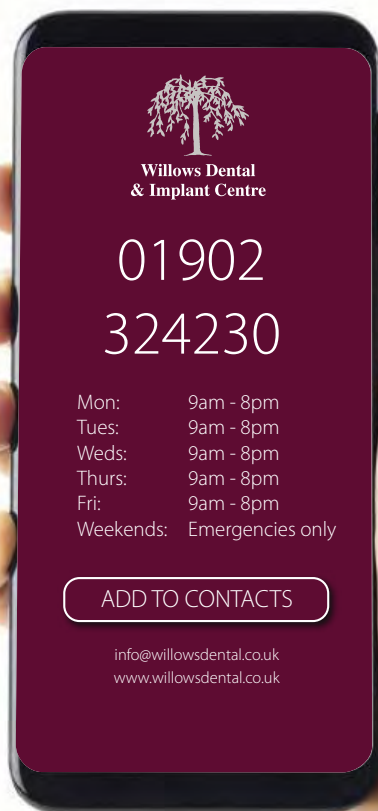

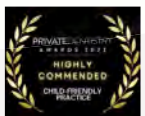
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
